MV girls track competes at three meets; Sheehy to Drake

The girls competed last Tuesday at the Anamosa Early Bird meet. As a team, the girls placed 3rd with a total of 102.50 points.

Starting with the field events, in the discus, Alison Sheehy threw 117' 6" placing 1st and receiving 10 points for the team. In the shot put, Lydia Helle threw 29' placing 9th and scoring 1 point for the team. In the long jump, Kailyn Hogan tied for 4th with a jump of 13' 4" gaining 4.5 points for the team. Brooke Elgin also competed in the long jump. She jumped 12' 9.75" placing 6th and gaining 3 points for the team.

In the running events, starting with the 100m dash, Brianna Mensen ran a 13.95, placing 4th and gaining 5 points for the team. In the 200m dash, Brooke Wilson ran a 30.25, placing 6th and gaining 3 team points. Kailyn Hogan also competed in the 200m dash, running a 31.02, placing 9th and gaining 1 team point. In the 400m dash, Brianna Mensen ran a 1:04.67, placing 3rd and gaining 6 team points. In the 800m run, Casey Fry ran a 2:52.33, placing 10th and gaining 1 team point. In the 100m hurdles, Kara Orcutt ran a 17.16, placing 2nd and gaining 8 team points. Angela Wendt ran a 17.87 in this event, placing 5th and gaining 4 points. In the 400m hurdles, Kara Orcutt ran a 1:12.50, placing 1st and gaining 10 team points. Cassidy Wilson also ran in this event running a 1:14.58, placing 2nd and gaining 8 points.

In the relay events, starting with the 4x100m relay, Ashley Stogdill, Brianna Mensen, Olivia Hoeger, and Aspen Britt ran a 54.74, placing 3rd and gaining 6 points.
