## Locals Compete in Dairy Quiz Bowl

LOUISVILLE, KY - Iowa is Runner-up in the National Invitational 4-H Dairy Quiz Bowl, a premier event designed to test the knowledge of youth, that took place at the North American International Livestock Exposition, November 6, 2004.

The first Dairy Quiz Bowl at the North American International was coordinated by Dr. Pete Spike of Ohio State University, Dr. Gale Baumgardner Betterly of Michigan State University and Dr. George Heersche of the University of Kentucky. The Dairy Quiz Bowl provides an educational experience to all youth participants and is regarded as a valuable educational tool in the dairy industry.

The Champion Iowa Team (Delaware County) placed 2nd among 20 teams and placed higher than any Iowa team has in their 24 years of participation. The team made their way past Wisconsin and Tennessee in the first two rounds, but was topped by New Hampshire in the third round which sent them to the consolation bracket. They continued to sail through three tough matches against Virginia, Minnesota and New Hampshire respectively before meeting the unbeaten Maryland team in the final. Iowa handily won the match, forcing another round, but Maryland won that one.
