

Conrad Sets School Record in 200M

April 13th the girls track team participated in the Anamosa Early Bird meet. The Cats took 7th place out of 16 teens.

Amy Conrad received first place in the 200 with a time of 27.03.

The Distance Medley Relay team of Conrad, Jordan Gibbs, Kelli Dabroski, and Amanda Harris came in second place with a time of 4:23.59. Brianne Boies and Harris both took third place in their events (100 Hurdles--Boies and 800--Harris). The Shuttle Hurdle Relay team of Boies, Bonny Jaeger, Mary Hoffmann, and Amy Whitman received fifth place.

The long jump with Jaeger, 1500 with Callie Krapfl, and the 4x100 team (Conrad, Gibbs, Dabroski, Boies) all took sixth place.

April 15th the Wildcats ran at the Tigerette Relays. MV received 8th place out of 20 teams participating at the meet.

Conrad again took first place in the 200 with a time of 26.23, setting a new school record. Harris placed third in the 3000 with a time of 11:24.69 and the Distance Medley Relay team also took third place.

Placing fourth was the Sprint Medley Relay team of Boies, Gibbs, Conrad, and Dabroski.

On Monday, April 18th the Cats hosted with their Wildcat Invite. The Wildcats placed third in Class A.

Events taking first place were the Distance Medley Relay team and the 1500 run by Harris. Second place events included the 200 run by Conrad (time: 26.36), 1500 run by Krapfl, and the High Jump with participant Dabroski. Krapfl took third place in the 800 and the 4X400 team also took third. In the 100 Hurdles Boies placed fourth as well as the 4X100 team. Events receiving fifth place were the Shuttle Hurdle Relay team and Conrad at the Shot Put. Receiving sixth place in their events were the 4X200 Relay team, Jaeger in the long jump, and the 4X400 team.

The Cats also competed at West Delaware last night. Results will be in next week's Echo.

Miles Continues to Dominate


Last Thursday night the boys track team competed at West Delaware and finished ninth out of 11 teams. MV tallied 12 points while Decorah won the meet with 95.

Scoring points for the Cats were Tristan Miles second in the discus with a throw of 153'5", Neal Johnson fourth in the 400M run in 52.94 and Blake Humpal in the 400M hurdles in 58.6. The 4x100 team of Humpal, Scott Hoeger, Miles and Donny Nordmann finished sixth in 46.16. The JV 4x200 relay of Jeremy Burke, Ethan Walton, Adam Domeyer and Brett Recker finished sixth in 1:47.08.

This past Tuesday night, the team traveled to CPU where they finished eighth with 23 points. CPU won the team title.

Mr. Smith said it was a very good meet, their best performance so far. "Our younger runners are really starting to perform well and our upperclassmen are beginning to drop their times and improve their distances," he stated.

Miles threw 156'2.5" to win the discus, hopefully a distance that will qualify him for the Drake Relays. Other individuals to score points were Humpal in the 400M hurdles in a time of 59.19, Mark Beatty fifth in the 800M run in 2:09.23, Brian Sibel fifth in the shot put with a heave of 44'9" and Nathan Burger sixth in the long jump with a leap of 17'4.25. The 4x100 relay of Humpal, Hoeger, Miles and Nordmann finished fifth in 45.96. Also finishing fifth was the 4x200 relay of Troy Smock,

Scott Hoeger, Michael Klostermann and Nordmann in 1:40.92.

On the JV front, the 4x800 relay of Josh Schindler, Jordan Keith, Domeyer and Cody Recker won in 9:30.15. The JV medley of Burke, Jon Jaeger, Domeyer and Cody Recker finished third in 4:13.88, while the 4x100 relay of Burke, Jaeger, Walton and Brian Jacobsmeyer finished fifth in 51.39. In sixth place was the 4x200 relay of Burke, Jacobsmeyer, Domeyer and Brett Recker in 1:47.28.

The Cats compete tonight at North Fayette.
