Robbie Mohr had three receptions totaling 49 yards.

Talking defense, Coach Drew stated that the team has to improve on their tackling. "We are not going to bring runners down with arm tackles."

Speaking of tackles, Jake Norlin led the defense with 11 tackles. Following him were Nathan Burger and Klostermann each making nine tackles. Achieving eight tackles that evening were Neal Johnson, Jacob Bawek and Chad Ries. Brian Wegmann added seven tackles to his tally, while Lechtenberg added six and Philip Roling added five. Lee Manson and Mohr each made four tackles at the game and Humpal made three. Sophomores Calvin Strum and Alex Glew each made two tackles for their team last Friday night and Jacob McDowell and Brian Sibel both made one tackle. Sibel also had one quarterback sack.
