Welcome Back

With the beginning of a new school year, it is always a time in which student and staff expectations and enthusiasm runs high. It also seems to always coincide with a number of changes. This year is no exception! First and foremost, as most of you know, we are in the process of realigning our elementary schools. Earlville Elementary will become our early childhood center and will house our preschool, junior kindergarten, and kindergarten students as well as the Delaware County Head Start program. Johnston Elementary will become our primary center and will house our 1st and 2nd graders. Delhi will now be our intermediate and secondary building and will house our students from grades 3 through 12. I would like to take this opportunity to personally thank all parents that participated in our conversations and provided us with information and your insight on how we could make our district even stronger for our children. I truly appreciate your participation, input and partnership in this process the past two years. Because of your involvement, our children will benefit in the end.

So as we do every summer, we are feverishly cleaning, scrubbing, waxing, painting, replacing carpet, and replacing old sinks and faucets. What is new this summer, we are making some minor adjustments to our bus routes, and methodically moving teachers from one building to another or from one room to another. All of this is a work in progress.

I also want to thank all of our parents and patrons that took the time to participate in our Revenue Purpose Statement vote this past spring. If you recall this vote was to extend our current Revenue Purpose Statement from 2021 until 2029. By allowing our district to extend this statement we have been able to start our remodeling project for our district facilities by partnering with OPN Architects. With feedback from teachers, associates, custodians, food service and our Board of Directors, some initial plans have been developed. Over the next six months we will be modifying the plans to meet our needs and our budget parameters. If all goes well, we may be able to start parts of the project late next spring or early summer.

I would like to thank all of our parents, community fire departments, district social and service organizations, our local Farm Bureau members and our patrons who took the time to listen to our Revenue Purpose Statement presentation and asked insightful questions to fully understand the process. Again, without your involvement and input in this process I know we would not of been able to move forward on this project.

In addition to the physical changes that are currently happening and are on the horizon, we also have a number of instructional changes that have occurred within our district. With the retirement of Rhea Knott, Hannah Crumpton has been hired as our new Elementary Art instructor. Carrie Elsinger will replace Barb Hollinrake as our new Elementary and Middle School Guidance Counselor. Larry Meyer will be leaving to take an administrative position in northeast Iowa, and Eric Conner will replace Mr. Meyer as our Elementary and Middle School PE instructor. Eric will also be our Head Baseball Coach and assist Mr. Dunlap in the boys' basketball program. Wes Wilson left MV to become the Head Football Coach at Monticello, and Chris Evers will now take over the program. Diane Freeze recently decided to retire after 24 years of service to our children and district. Jennifer Teymer will replace Diane at Johnston. Finally Natasha Steger has been hired as a special education associate at Johnston. So please take time to welcome all of these new individuals to our Wildcat family when you see them in our schools.

All of us are extremely excited about the 2016 - 2017 school year. With the changes to our elementary alignment, our upcoming remodeling project, our new teachers, coaches and support staff that will be joining our MV family, I know it will be a fantastic year! Regular Board Meeting

June 20, 2016

The regular meeting of the Maquoketa Valley Board of Education was called to order by President John Zietlow at 6:00 p.m. in the Middle School Conference Room in Delhi, Iowa. All motions carried unanimously unless otherwise noted. Five board members were present. There were two staff present and two visitors present. The agenda and consent items were approved.

Six open enrollment requests out were approved.

The Board called for bread and milk bids for the 2016/2017 school year to be approved at the July meeting.

Board Secretary, Erika Imler, was authorized to pay bills owed yet this fiscal year prior to June 30th.

The following personnel recommendations were approved: Larry Meyer – resignation as Elem/MS Physical Education Teacher, Head HS Baseball; Eric Conner – employed as Elem/MS Physical Education Teacher, Head HS Baseball and Assistant Boys Basketball Coach; Chris Evers – employed as Head HS Football Coach; Hannah Crumpton – employed as MS Volleyball Coach and Large Group Speech Letter of Assignment; Diane Freeze – resignation as Johnston Teacher Associate Ron Besler – resignation as Assistant Boys Basketball Coach Alex O'Connell – employed as Assistant Baseball Coach Jennifer Teymer – employed as Johnston Teacher Associate

The Board as well as Supt. Tuetken expressed their appreciation to Mrs. Freeze and her dedication to the Maquoketa Valley Community School District.

Language changes to board policy 408.000 Fringe Benefits Classified Staff and policy 501.080 Wellness Policy were reviewed and approved.

Student fees and prices for the 2016/2017 school year were reviewed. A five cent increase was approved for all food service prices. All other fees will remain the same. The following food service and student fees were set for the 2016/2017 school year: Student Lunch (K-5) \$2.15; Student Lunch (K-12) \$2.40; 7-12 Second Entrée \$1.50; Extra Carton of Milk \$0.45; Adult Lunch \$3.55; Student Breakfast \$1.55; Adult Breakfast \$2.45; Student Materials Fee (PS) \$20.00; Student Materials Fee (JK-6) \$55.00; Student Materials Fee (7-12) \$70.00; Musical Instrument Rent \$50.00; Second Musical Instrument Rent \$25.00; Music Uniform Cleaning \$25.

The Board approved the increasing the 2016/2017 Substitute Teacher rate \$5.00 per day from \$105.00 to \$110.00.

The Board reviewed the IASB Legislative Action Priorities and will begin the process of choosing the District's top five priorities for 2016/2017.

Supt. Tuetken took a few minutes to discuss the board goal setting process and presented the Director's with information on previous Board goals and Superintendent goals. Further discussion on this process will take place at the July meeting.

At 6:44 p.m. in a motion by Feldmann, seconded by Dabroski the Board entered into a closed session pursuant to Chapter 21.9 of the Code of Iowa for the purpose of discussing strategy in matters relating to employment conditions of employees of the school who are not covered by the collective bargaining agreement. A roll call vote was answered all ayes. At 6:49 the Board entered into open session.

The Board approved a modification to #13 in the Superintendent Contract to allow for a three year contract to be put into place.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:50 p.m.

Regular Board Meeting

July 18, 2016

The regular meeting of the Maquoketa Valley Board of Education was called to order by President John Zietlow at 6:00 p.m. in the Middle School Conference Room in Delhi, Iowa. All motions carried unanimously unless otherwise noted. Four board members were present. There were two staff present and three visitors present. The agenda and consent items were approved.

Larry and Laura Schuman took a few minutes to address the Board concerning open enrollment guidelines and concerns regarding equal playing time in extracurricular activities.

Bimbo Bakeries will provide the district bakery needs and Prairie Farms will supply the dairy needs for the 2016-2017 school year.

The following personnel recommendations were approved: Melissa Hess – employed as TLC Mentor; Troy Osterhaus – employed as Middle School Boys Basketball Coach

The Board approved the 2016-2017 Preschool, Delhi Elementary, Earlville Elementary, Johnston Elementary, Middle School and High School Student and Staff Handbooks as well as the Coaches/Sponsor Handbook. The Board approved the participation in the National Hot Lunch Program for the 2016-2017 school year.

The Board approved the Superintendent authority to seek the advice of appropriate legal counsel as needed among the firms listed: Ahlers, Cooney, Dorweilder of Des Moines; The Gruhn Law Firm of Cedar Rapids; Lynch Dallas, P.C. of Cedar Rapids; The Compton Law Firm of Strawberry Point; Tom Hanson, Manchester; Swisher and Cohrt, Waterloo; Iowa Association of School Boards and School Administrators of Iowa.

Erika Imler was appointed as the District Board Secretary/Treasurer for the 2016-2017 school year.

The Board reviewed the IASB Legislative Action Priorities and will finalize the District's top five priorities for 2016-2017.

Supt. Tuetken presented the Board with a rough draft of Board and Superintendent Goals as well as guiding principles and expectations for the 2016-2017 school year and Superintendent evaluation. Supt. Tuetken reviewed the indicators and goals with the Board and notated possible changes and modifications. Further discussion of these goals and indicators will take place at the August meeting.

In other information, school registration is scheduled for Tuesday, August 9th from 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. at the Delhi campus. E-registration will be used again this year and fees associated with the online payment system will be waived during this time.

The Board discussed possible work sessions for the upcoming school year.

The meeting adjourned at 6:44 p.m.

Registration and 2016-17 School Fees

Registration of students and payment of fees will be <u>**Tuesday, August 9**</u> from 9:00 AM until 7:00 PM. Registration is for **one day in DELHI only** at the Middle School.

Opening day of school will be Tuesday, August 23, 2016. The normal school day hours are 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM.

Once again parents will be able to pay their 2016-17 school year fees, submit lunch money and update contact and emergency information on PowerSchool. Parents have the option to complete registration from home or come to school on August 9th when school personnel will be on hand to assist with the registration proces. Through the PowerSchool link, also located on the school website, parents may update information for all children enrolled in school. It is especially important for parents to update e-mail addresses, since notices of early dismissals, make-up information, etc. are now being sent that way. Also, cell phone numbers need to be updated for text alerts. Many forms are located on the school website (www.maguoketa-v.k12.ia.us) including this August newsletter, Free/Reduced Form, Physical Form and many more.

For those families who apply for Free or Reduced meals, it is still best to come to school on registration day August <u>9th</u>. Also, Families new to MV, please come to school for Registration and bring the social security numbers of your child/ren.

Parents are also being encouraged to use our new online payment program RevTrak which replaces PayForlt. (Look for the flyer in this newsletter.) With this new program your online payments are made using your same PowerSchool login username and password. Fees incurred paying online will be waived August 8 through August 14.

The Assignment Book (for 3rd - 8th graders) may be purchased during Registration or on Back to School Night or first day of school. If you purchase it on line using RevTrak, your child's book will be in his/her classroom the first day of school.

Wellness Committee Recommendations

Last March the Maquoketa Valley Wellness Committee met to discuss the school's Wellness Policy and changes that needed to be made within the policy and within the school setting. This committee is comprised of patrons of the district, including a Physician's Assistant, members of the Athletic Boosters, parents, Superintendent, school dietary personnel, concession stand lead, a fitness trainer and the school nurse.

One thing that I have found, working with our First Grade students over the past few years, is that many of them were consuming three chocolate milk servings at school per day. This is almost 60 gm of sugar. It was from this finding and much discussion that the following recommendations were made.

Starting next school year, students of all grade levels will only have chocolate milk options at breakfast and lunch time, and the elementary snack time milk will be completely eliminated. (2016-17)

The following school year, students will only have white milk as an option at breakfast and the only time chocolate milk will be served is at lunch on Friday, for our elementary and middle school students. We will continue with the no snack milk for elementary students. (2017-18)

In addition we will encourage teachers and staff, of all grade levels, to take water breaks. We are looking into getting water bottle filling stations so that there is less time spent at the fountains.

You may be asking, why the changes are needed? Well, here's some scary stats.

What should children have for added sugar in their diets per the American Heart Association:

Preschool children should have 16gm or 4tsp Preteen and teen 20-32gm or 5-8tsp Age 4-8 12gm or 3tsp

What children are actually getting for sugar in their diets:

Children 1-3 are getting 48gm or 12tsp Preteens to teens 136gm or 34tsp Age 4-8 84gm or 21tsp

How much sugar is in milk? White milk, no fat, 11gm or almost 3 tsp, Chocolate milk 18gm which is over 4tsp of sugar.

Amount of water a person should drink per day: half your body weight or until urine is clear. Dehydration leads to headaches, sluggishness, and many systemic problems.

We are certainly not suggesting that students not consume milk products. Students still need to get their calcium and other nutrients that the dairy products supply. What we are suggesting is that we look for healthier options. If you have questions, please feel free to contact myself or Mr. Tuetken.


