Volleyball team gets a first-round win over Ed-Co

A jam-packed two weeks of volleyball pushed the Cats to full potential and to the second round of district play. Out of 7 games, the team took home 3 wins and 4 losses. In the end, it was enough to take down Ed-Co on Tuesday night and to keep playing for another week.

During the second week of October, the volleyball team faced off against North Linn to help determine if the team would be placed 3rd or 4th for the Conference Tournament. The game ended in a 0-3 defeat with match scores: 20-25, 16-25, and 28-30.

It was a rough night for the team as they struggled with serves and aggressiveness at the net. They finished with an 89% serving efficiency and 15 kills. The back row helped push the team forward with 24 digs: 6 from Aspen Britt, 5 from Maci Frieburger, 4 from Angie Wilson, and 3 from Caitlyn Gibbs. The Cats also finished with 8 blocks with 3 from both Briana Mensen and Megan Mensen.

The next Tuesday, the Cats played their final home volleyball game against Alburnett. They walked away with a 2-3 loss and a 4th place seat in the Conference Tournament. The match scores were: 22-25, 25-23, 26-24, 18-25, and 14-16.

The team finished with 32 kills, with 9 each from Macy Hoeger and Megan Mensen. They also had 11 blocks: 4 from Brianna Mensen and 3 from Megan Mensen. Maddy Anderegg led with assists with 29.

In the back row, a total of 33 digs helped the Cats. 12 were from Wilson, 6 from Digmann, 5 from Macy Anderegg, and 4 from Freiburger. The team also finished with an 88% serving efficiency with 8 aces. Megan Mensen went 21 for 22, Digmann went 17 for 20, and Brianna Mensen went 13 for 14.

Because of their 4th place finish, the team played at Springville last Thursday against Springville and Lisbon to find out if they would advance to the Saturday tournament. They walked away with a win against Lisbon and a loss against Springville, which was enough to get them to Saturday.

Lisbon was the first game, and the Cats had a 2-0 win. The match scores were 21-14, and 21-18.

The team had a 97% serving ef-

ficiency against Lisbon and only missed one serve. There were also 3 aces, all from Brianna Mensen.

The back row had 10 digs: 3 from Frieburger, and 2 from Wilson and Britt. The front row had 11 kills. Notable hitters were Hoeger with 4 kills, and Digmann and Frieburger with 3 a piece.

After Lisbon, the team fought against Springville and finished 0-2. The match scores were 18-21, 15-21.

Once again, serving helped fuel the team as they went 32 for 34 serves. They also had 4 aces, 2 from Digmann. Digmann also helped earn 3 kills along with Frieburger and Brianna Mensen. Maddy Anderegg led assists with 10.

The team moved on to the Saturday tournament where they faced Calamus-Wheatland once again for a tough loss. The matches ended with a 0-2 finish and match scores 17-21, and 17-21.

Hoeger led with 6 kills with Digmann with 4. Danica Fjelstul and Megan Mensen both had 2. The team ended with 16 kills and a 29% kill efficiency. Maddy Anderegg led assists with 14.

Behind them, the back row had 20 digs, 4 from Caitlin Schuman and Wilson, and 3 from Macy Anderegg and Digmann. The Cats finished once again with a 91% serving efficiency.

Despite the loss, the team came back to play one more game for the day against Midland. The Cats took the 2-0 win for this one with match scores 21-17, and 22-20.

The Cats had a 90% serving efficiency. Lea Ries went 8 for 8 and Fjelstul went 6 for 7. Up at the net, Fjelstul also had 5 out of the 9 kills.

All the Cats hard work and dedication led up to their game against Ed-Co on Tuesday for the first round of district play. They walked away with multiple new team records and a win to show for it. Anyone watching could tell the Wildcats left it all out on the floor. The team finished with 3-1 win. The match scores were 25-19, 22-25, 25-21, and 25-22.

In the front row, the Cats had an astounding 21.7% kill efficiency, with 30 kills. Brianna Mensen and Fjelstul led with 8 kills a piece. Hoeger had 7 while Digmann had 5. Maddy Anderegg and Lea Ries went neck and neck for assists. Anderegg had 23 while Ries had 18.

Behind them, the back row was on fire. They had a record breaking 98 digs. Wilson led with 17 while Britt had 16. Emily LaGrant and Macy Anderegg had 14 each. Sienna Becker had 11, and Hoeger had 10.

Serving also pushed the Cats to win. They had a 96% serving efficiency for the game and finished with 9 aces. Macy Hoeger went 19 for 19 with 5 aces. Megan Mensen went 12 for 12 with 2 aces and Digmann went 14 for 14 with 1 ace.

The Lady Cats' dedication on the court has gotten them to the second round, the first time in team history. Join the team at Wapsie Valley next Tuesday. Every cheer helps!




