

NON-RESIDENT STUDENTS

Students who are eligible to attend an Iowa public school but who are not legal residents of this district may be admitted to school at the discretion of the Superintendent upon application and payment of tuition. The tuition rate shall be the current per-pupil cost of the district as authorized by the Department of Education.

Resident students whose families move from the school district after the start of a semester, and who wish to complete the semester in the school district, may be permitted to attend without the payment of tuition in the discretion of the Superintendent. These students, other than students in grades eleven and twelve, must have the recommendation of the principal as well as a resident guardian identified for purposes of administration.

Students in grades eleven or twelve who are no longer residents of the school district, but were residents in the preceding school year, may continue to attend school until they graduate without the payment of tuition. These students must have a resident guardian identified for purposes of administration.

Non-resident students who are eligible to attend an Iowa public school and who have positive evidence they will become legal residents of the school district prior to October 1 may be allowed to attend without the payment of tuition.

It shall be the responsibility of the Superintendent to develop administrative rules for this policy.
