Allie Knipper was the dig leader for the night with 4. The Fresh/Soph Team has an overall set record of 16-7 and 8-3 match record. In conference matches they are 4-1.

The Junior Varsity team also played a three-set match losing the first set 17-21, then won the next two sets 21-16 and 15-6 to win the match. Maddy Anderegg was 9 for 10 serving with 3 service aces and had 9 assists. Kara Orcutt led the Wildcats in kills with 4, was 3 for 3 serving with 1 service ace and 6 digs. Madison Imler led in the digs department with 8 and was 3 for 3 serving. The Junior Varsity team now has an overall 12-5 set record and 6-2 match record on the year. In conference matches they are also 4-1.

The Varsity game was an exciting match. The Wildcats started out slow again losing the first two sets with both set scores of 22-25. The third set the Wildcats rallied


"I was proud of the girls for not


