In the 800m run, Casey Fry ran a 2:47.99, placing 8th, gaining 1 point. In the 1500m run, Rejji Smith ran a 5:36.39, placing 8th, gaining 1 point. In the 3000m run, Nichole Winter ran a 13:15.11, placing 6th, gaining 3 points and Mikayla Callan ran a 14:25.08, placing 7th, gaining 2 points. In the 100m Hurdles, Kara Orcutt ran a 17.05, placing 1st, gaining 10 team points and Cassiddy Wilson ran a 17.95, placing 3rd, gaining 6 points. In the 400m Hurdles, Kara Orcutt ran a 1:09.53, placing 1st, gaining 10 points and Cassiddy Wilson ran a 1:15.01, placing 5th, gaining 4 points.

In the relay events, Ashley Stogdill, Megan Hogan, Caitlin Schuman, and Aspen Britt competed in the 4x100m relay. They ran a 55.00, placing 4th, gaining 5 points. Caitlin Schuman, Madison Imler, Ashley Stogdill, and Aspen Britt competed in the Sprint Medley. They ran a 1:58.96, placing 4th, gaining 5 points. Caitlin Schuman, Brooke Wilson, Aspen Britt, and Rejji Smith competed in the Distance Medley. They ran a 4:38.81, placing 3rd, gaining 6 points. 
