

Stats for this past Tuesday's close game vs #1 ranked Springville will be posted in next week's issue.


Tonight the Wildcats will take on the Ed-Co Vikings at home with JV starting at 4:30, and Varsity to follow at 6. Come out and support!

•Do not cram! Taking breaks can help you absorb more information.


•Try to stay positive about it. I am one to say I'm not going to do good on a test, but it is proven that if you are thinking positively before a test you will have higher scores!
