Busy schedule for track girls, Sheehy at Drake

The girls competed at West Delaware last Thursday. They placed 13th overall, with a total of 16 points.

In the field events, Alison Sheehy PRed for the second time this week, with a throw of 127', gaining 10 points for the team by placing 1st. She did official qualify for Drake and competed last night at 4.

In the running events, in the 400m Hurdles, Cassidy Wilson ran a 1:13.86, placing 6th.

In the relay events, starting with the 4x200m relay, Caitlin Schuman, Sam Wall, Aspen Britt, and Brianna Mensen ran a 1:55.90, placing 6th. In the 4x400m relay, Kara Orcutt, Mensen, Wall and Britt ran a 4:23.03, placing 5th. In the 4x800m relay, Reiji Smith, Britt, Wilson, and Mensen ran a 10:43.99, placing 6th.. In the Distance-Medley Relay, Madison Imler, Maddy Anderegg, Orcutt, and Casey Fry ran a 5:02.42, placing 6th.

On Monday night the girls started their busy week with a meet at Center-Point Urbana. The girls placed 3rd with a total of 57, points.

Starting with the 100m dash, Mensen ran a 13.80, placing 4th. In the 200m dash, Wall ran a 27.93, placing 4th. In the 400m dash, Britt ran a 1:03.12, placing 2nd. In the 800m run, Wilson ran a 2:43.63, placing 4th. In the 100m hurdles, Kara Orcutt ran a 18.16, placing 5th.

In the relay events, the 4x100m relay team of Ashley Stogdill, Schuman, Mensen, and Britt ran a 53.59, placing 3rd. In the 4x200m relay, Imler, Schuman, Stogdill, and Mensen ran a 1:55.35, placing 3rd. In the 4x400m relay, Orcutt, Mensen, Wall, and Britt ran a 4:17.52, placing 2nd. In the Sprint-Medley Relay, Schuman, Stogdill, Wall, and Britt ran a 1:57.50, placing 2nd. In the Distance-Medley Relay, Stogdill, Danica Fjelstul, Orcutt, and Wilson ran a 4:52.09, placing 6th. In the Shuttle Hurdle relay, Katilyn Deutmeyer, Angela Wendt, Wilson, and Orcutt ran a 1:12.99, placing



3rd.

The girls competed at the Anamosa Co-Ed meet on Tuesday. They had a total of 33 points, placing 9th overall.

In the discus, Sheehy threw a total of 116' 0.50" placing 1st.

In the relay events, starting with the 4x100m relay, Stogdill, Mensen, Wall, and Britt ran a 52.11, placing 1st. In the 4x800m relay, Smith, Fry, Nichole Winter, and Mensen ran an 11:14.43, placing 6th. The Sprint-Medley Relay team of Mensen, Stogdill, Wall, and Britt ran a 1:55.93, placing 5th. The Distance-Medley relay team of Schuman, Fjestul, Orcutt, and Wilson ran a 4:45.40, placing 8th. The Shuttle Hurdle team of Wendt, Olivia Hoeger, Wilson, and Orcutt ran a 1:13.43, placing 4th.

The girls compete at Cascade tonight.

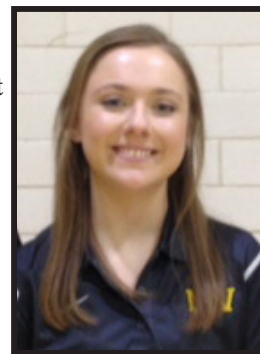

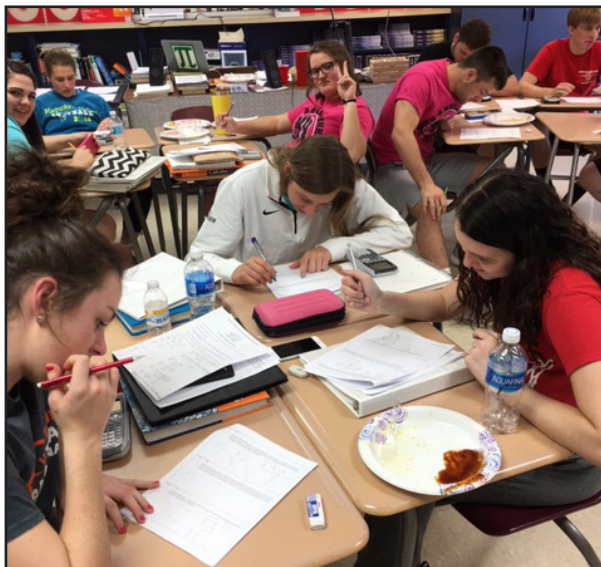

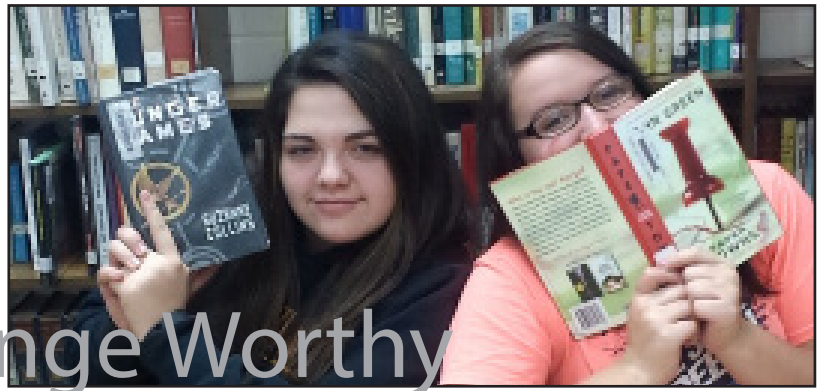
