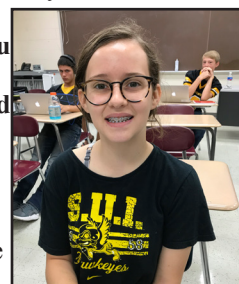
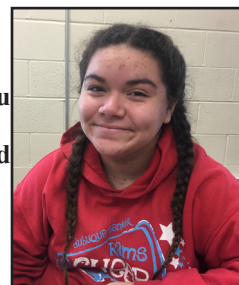

I love learning new dances and seeing it come together. It's really fun when we clean a dance, and then it looks really great out on the floor.

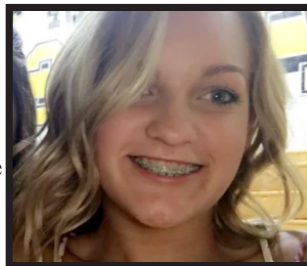

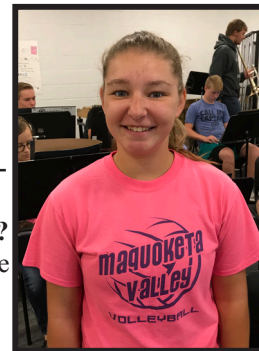

Our first story this week is Social Media Snitch.

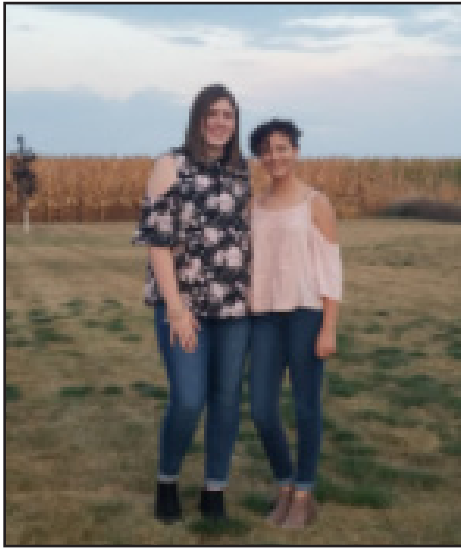

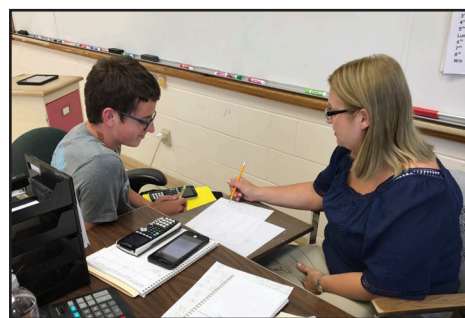
