Students score well on national test

Maquoketa Valley strives to find new ways to prepare students for the future. This year they offered a new college class, taught by Mrs. Moenck, called Pre-Employability Strategies. This class helps students with various skills they will use in the workforce. Already, students have created a resume, cover letter, reference list, and learned various soft skills and interview skills. In December the students of the class took about a three hour test called the NCRC which was spread throughout three days.

NCRC stands for National Career Readiness Certificate. The assessment tests a student's "real-world" skills using everyday math and reading situations. This test can be valuable because it can predict how students will perform in the workforce. The test was free for students to take and many career pathways find it useful.

By taking this ACT WorkKeys assessment, students will walk away with a certificate that tells employers about their skills and abilities in several areas. The subjects the students test over are as

follows: applied mathematics, workplace documents (reading and comprehending written documents such as emails, memos, policies, websites, regulations, etc.), and graphic literacy (interpreting graphs, forms, diagrams, floor plans, charts, order forms, etc.). After each test students receive a score of how well they understand each topic. A score six or higher is considered a Platinum, five is a Gold, four would be Silver, and three is a Bronze. The lowest score of the three tests determines the overall score. Some employers will look at the level of the certificate during the hiring process.

The current Pre-Employability Strategies class has seven students. Overall, two students received a Platinum, one received a Gold, three students received Silver scores, and one student received an overall Bronze. Digging a little deeper, in the Applied Math category the class had: four Platinum scores, one Gold, two Silver and no Bronze. In the Workplace Documents (Reading) the class received: two Platinum, two Gold, two Silver, and one

Bronze. In the Graphic Literacy (Analyzing Data) the class had: four Platinum, three Gold, and no Silver or Bronze. The average overall score in Delaware County is a Silver. Therefore, six of the seven students received an overall score at or above average for our county. Our students especially excelled in the Graphic Literacy where all students scored a Gold or above, which is very impressive.

Mrs. Moenck stated, "Students took the NCRC very seriously and a friendly competitiveness took over the classroom in the weeks before the assessments, pushing the students to do their best work."

She also had information about the proctor of the test, "Our proctor, Holly Maurer from NICC, mentioned that our students at MV were some of the most prepared and enthusiastic testers that she has worked with during the NCRC process." Mrs. Moenck continued, "I am very proud of these students, the work that they have put forth, and their overall success!" The proctor, Holly Maurer, is allowing students to retake specific tests if they wish to do so.

Boys fight in close battles, defeat CV Christian

Elgin also had a nice night from the free throw line, making 4 of his 4 shots. The team as a whole did a much better job from the free throw line, making 66.7% of shots.

Before break ended, the boys played this Monday at East Buchanan. Again battling hard against the Buccaneers but falling with a final score of 58-47.

Leading in points was Tyson Tucker, with 15 total points. Trevor Elgin followed with 12 points. Brian Heims and Andrew Holtz each scored 6 points.

Our leaders in rebounds were Tyson Tucker, Cole Willenbring, Trevor Elgin, Heath Gibbs and Brian Heims, each picking up 4 rebounds.

Tyson Tucker had a nice night at the free throw line making over 50% of his shots. Tucker also led in assists with 7 total. Trevor led in steals with 4.

The boys will competed at home last Friday against Prince of Peace. After an extremely close game, the boys fell to the Irish in the last few seconds with a final score of 52-54.

"I thought the game went well. We had a really nice third quarter and a lot of looks in the paint," stated Coach Dunlap. "We took the lead three times in the first quarter but we struggled in the second quarter which hurt us. We had too many turnovers and fouls, which we really can't control fouls. We outrebounded Prince of Peace which is good."

Coach Dunlap stated, "Because we had a lot of easy looks in the paint but we didn't finish, if we had a couple more of those, we would've won the game. We had a lot of nice three point looks that went in and out. If we put some of those down we would've won the game."

Leading in rebounds was Trevor Elgin, Tyson Tucker, Cole Willenbring, and Heath Gibbs. Elgin had a total of 10 rebounds. Tucker had 7 rebounds. Willenbring and Gibbs each picked up 4 rebounds.

Leading in steals was Cole Willenbring and Trevor Elgin, each with 2 total. Andrew had 3 assists. Trevor Elgin also made over half of his 3 point shots.

"I thought Trevor Elgin and Tyson Tucker had a really good game. Trevor had a double- double which is excellent," Coach Dunlap commented. "Andrew Holtz is playing like we need him too. He is being more aggressive offensively and getting to the rim more, but we still need him to shoot more."

Next, the boys had a game on Tuesday at Springville against Cedar Valley Christian. They had a close first half and eventually won with a final score of 58-41.

"As a team we almost tripled them in rebounds. We shot almost 70% from the free throw line," said Coach Dunlap.

Leading in points was Trevor Elgin, Heath Gibbs, and Tyson Tucker. Trevor scored a total of 31 points. Heath scored 10 points total. Tyson scored 8 points for the team.

Leading in rebounds was Tyson Tucker, Trevor Elgin, Heath Gibbs, and Cole Willenbring. Tyson, Heath, and Trevor had 10 rebounds each. Cole followed with 4 rebounds.

Trevor Elgin had an excellent night, making 12 of his 18 two- point shots as well as making 5 of 8 of his three point shots. He also led in steals with Heath Gibbs, each having 2 steals. Cole Willenbring had an outstanding 5 assists. As a team, they did better for free throws, making 9 of 13 shots.

"Trevor Elgin had an outstanding game. He had a double- double and he scored 31 points which is pretty unheard of. He also had 10 rebounds and shot 5 for 8 from the three point line which is outstanding especially from that far away," commented Coach Dunlap. "We got the first double-double out of Heath for the season which is great. Tyson was also one bucket away from also having a double-double. Tyson was sick so he didn't play as much as he usually does but he had a really nice second half and had ten rebounds."

Last Saturday the Maquoketa Valley Wrestling Team held their annual "Wildcat Duals". With no shortage of competition, the Cats hosted multiple 1A and 2A teams including; Beckman Catholic, Midland, Wilton, Starmont and Center Point-Urbana.

Coach Andrews said he was happy overall with how the day went. "We are dealing with a number of injuries right now and have been having guys wrestle up in order to help our team out. We ran into some very tough teams and that should do nothing but help us as we move closer to the postseason."

The Wildcats started the day off versus Starmont. The boys ended up beating the Stars 45 to 20. Those who received a win were: Robert Hildebrand with a fall at 5:20 and Mitch Smith with a decision 5-4. Those who received forfeits were: Parker Sternhagen, Tim Harmon, Chance Downs, Carter Stahlberg, and Michael Feldmann.

The Wildcats moved on to face the eventual Dual Team Champions - Beckman. Though they put up a good fight. The Wildcats lost 54 to 21. Those who received a fall were Canyon Richardson at 2:19 and Tim Harmon at 3:38. Parker Sternhagen also won by decision 4-3. Michael Feldmann received a forfeit.
