Last Thursday the Maquoketa Valley Wrestling Team wrapped up their regular dual season at Center Point- Urbana against the South Tama Trojans, Maquoketa Cardinals, and of course the Stormin' Pointers of CPU.

The Cats kicked off the night against the highly ranked wrestlers of South Tama. In the end, the powerhouse Trojans were just too much for the Wildcats with the final team score being 60 to 12. Parker Sternhagen earned a pin at 1:57. Cole Kruse received a forfeit.

After a rough start, the Wildcats shook off the dust and went back to work against the host CPU. With a great team effort by the entire line-up the Wildcats were able to knock of the Stormin' Pointers 40 to 36. Those who received a pin were: Evan Elgin at 3:03, Cole Kruse at 2:18, and Michael Feldmann at 0:45. Those who received a technical fall were: Chance Downs 16-0 and Mitch Smith 16-1. Robert Hildebrand and Dylan Happel both received forfeits.

The wrestlers completed their final dual of the season in impressive fashion versus the Maquoketa Cardinals. Earning multiple bonus point wins the Cats put the out of reach completing the final dual 60 to 24. Those who earned a pin were: Tim Harmon at 1:31, Downs at 0:55, Hildebrand at 1:52, Smith at 1:10, Evan Elgin at 4:56, Happel at 2:36, Cole Kruse at 0:34, and

Feldmann at 1:58. Dylan Lane and Canyon Richardson received forfeits.

Coach Andrews had this to say about the team's performance. "I was happy to see how the guys responded after coming out and falling short against a very tough South Tama team. The guys fought back and picked up two quality dual meet victories to end the night. They chose to keep fighting and to end the night on two high notes. That shows you the character of these guys and we hope to continue this momentum into conference and the post-season."

Coach Andrews and the Wildcats finished the season with a 23-10 dual team record.

Additionally last week, was the Annual Tri-Rivers Conference Wrestling Meet, held at Alburnett High School. The Wildcats sent 11 wrestlers Saturday to compete for conference champion. Of those who wrestled, eight were able to make their way to the podium.

"I was pleased with our effort," stated Coach Andrews. "Our guys have made good improvements over the past month. For having three open weights due to sickness and illness I was happy to come away a fourth place finish. We had a number of guys wrestle up at higher weight classes to fill in our line up. Hopefully we can get a little healthier this week so we can make a good run at the post season."

Harmon placed 5th at 138 pounds. Happel also placed 5th at 182 pounds. Richardson placed 4th at 120 pounds. Hildebrand placed 4th at 152 pounds. Elgin placed 4th at 170 pounds. Cole Kruse placed 4th at 220 pounds. Downs placed 3rd at 145 pounds. Carson Wright also placed 3rd at 195 pounds. Feldmann finished as runner-up at heavyweight. Smith was the lone 2018 Tri-Rivers Conference Champion at 160 pounds! Overall, the Wildcats finished 4th as a team with 129.5 points.

The Wildcats officially move into the postseason tomorrow as they compete at their Class 1A Sectionals held in Cascade. Be sure to come out and support your fellow Wildcats! Wrestling starts at noon!




