In the running events, in the 100m dash, Mitchell Neuzil ran a 12.33 which left him with a third place finish. In the 800m run, Chance Downs ran a 2:11.05, placing fifth. In the 1600m run, Brenden Hogan ran a 4:54.95, also placing fifth. Brock Hillers and Chad Neuzil both competed in the 110m hurdles. Hillers ran a 16.30 which left him in fifth place. Chad placed seventh with a time of 16.40.

The boys did very well in their relay events also. Starting with the 4x100m relay, Mitchell Neuzil, Gianpaolo Pillon, Chad Neuzil, and Daniel Hunter ran a 46.43, placing fourth. The weight men's 4x100m relay, Michael Feldmann, Alex Digman, Andrew Hildebrand, and Brody Sevart ran a 51.11. This team placed first with an over two second finish over all of the other teams. The 4x200m relay, consisting of Mitchell Neuzil, Alex Mc-Cusker, Daniel Hunter, and Derek Becker, ran a 1:37.01. This team placed third. In the 4x400m relay, Derek Becker, Chance Downs, Daniel Hunter, and Alex Mc-Cusker ran a 3:41.23, and placed fifth. In the 4x800m relay, Chance Downs, Derek Becker, Derek Mensen, and Brenden Hogan ran an 8:46.58, placing third. The Shuttle Hurdle Relay team of Brock Hillers, Derek Becker, Tiege Hunt, and Chad Neuzil ran a 1:02.37, which broke the school record and they placed third.

The boys competed at Center Point Urbana on Tuesday and finished 10th as a team.

Hogan finished fourth in the 1600 Meter Run in 4:55.07. Chance Downs finished fifth in the 800M run in 2:08.74. In the 400M hurdles, Hillers finished sixth in 1:02.94. He also finished sixth in the 110M high hurdles in 16.69.

The 4 X 200 Relay of Mitchell Neuzil, McCusker, Hunter and Chad Neuzil finished fifth in 1:37.94. The 4 X 800 Relay of Downs, Hogan, Ethan Doyl and Derek Mensen finished sixth in 9:04.41.

In field events, Blake Becker earned a sixth place finish in the discus with a throw of 119-02. Brian Heims finished sixth in the shot put with 39-04.

While most students were focused on their classes Tuesday, Kiesha Stelken accompanied her grandfather, Steve McAreavy who served in Vietnam, on the 31st Eastern Iowa Honor Flight.

Stelken said the one day adventure was a very long day but enjoyable day. Their flight left Cedar Rapids at 7:30am CST and arrived in DC around 9am EST.

They saw the WWII memorial, Navy museum, Air Force Museum, FDR, Vietnam, Korean, and Lincoln memorials.

"[The Vietnam Memorial] was by far my favorite place that we stopped at for the day," stated Stelken. "It was so inspiring to me to see every name of those who passed away during Vietnam. One of the vets found a name that they knew on the wall. He started tearing up after he found the name. My grandpa and I were looking for a person that my grandpa went to bootcamp with; unfortunately, we didn't find his name."

They also visited Arlington National Cemetery. "It was crazy seeing how all of the gravestones lined up perfectly. While we were there we witnessed the changing of the guards at the tomb of the unknown. You could see exactly where they walked from their shoe polish."

Their second to last stop was at Hiroshima. "We were supposed to stop at the Marine museum at the time, but it was under construction. They say that if you drive around Hiroshima the flag looks like it is rising up and down (we couldn't get close enough due to construction)."

After the whirlwind sightseeing, the honorees and their guardians left for the airport to head home. When they arrived back in Cedar Rapids, they were greeted by state troopers out of the terminal. The entire waiting area was full of people consisting of a band, Girl Scout troops, Boy Scout troops, family and friends.

"It is definitely a trip that I will remember for the rest of my life. It was an honor to go see all of the memorials and spend the day with my grandpa. It was great to spend some one on one time with him. He might not be alive much longer since he has stage 4 cancer. It was an honor that he wanted me to be his guardian on the 31st Eastern Iowa Honor Flight."

Stelken said the trip meant a lot to her grandfather. "Orignally he wanted to go on the trip for me since I had never been
