TEL students prepare for trip



Girls earn fourth place at conference meet, Wall sets new school record

Happy final Friday, Seniors and welcome back, Wildcat Fans! On Monday the girls competed in the co-ed Conference Meet at Central City. The girls finished in fourth place with a total of 68 points.

Starting with the field events, Lydia Helle placed in both the discus and shot put. Helle threw a 108' in the discus, placing first and gaining ten team points. In the shot put, Helle threw a 34'4" placing second and gaining eight team points.

In the running events, Sam Wall placed first in the 100m dash with a time of 13.01, gaining ten team points. Wall also competed in the 200m dash, where she placed second with a time of 26.36 and gaining eight team points. Despite a second place finish, Wall broke the school record in this event! Casey Fry ran a 2:51.93 in the 800m run, placing eighth and gaining one team point. In the 3000m run, Reiji Smith ran a 15:20.72, placing seventh and gaining two team points. Kara Orcutt competed in both the 100m and 400m hurdles. In the 100m hurdles, she placed third with a time

of 17.42 while gaining six team points. In the 400m hurdles, Orcutt ran a 1:14.88, placing third and again gaining six team points.

In the relay events, starting with the 4x100m relay, Payton Beaman, Kailyn Hogan, Brooke Wilson, and Sam Wall competed with a time of 53.48, placing fifth and gaining four team points. Emerson Whittenbaugh, Maddy Anderegg, Brooke Wilson, and Kailyn Hogan competed in the 4x200m relay. They placed eighth with a time of 2:01.20, and gained one team point. In the 4x400m relay, Payton Beaman, Allison Knipper, Kara Orcutt, and Sam Wall ran a 4:25.82, placing fourth and gaining five team points. In the 4x800m relay, Casey Fry, Emerson Whittenbaugh, Jaiden Porter, and Reiji Smith ran a 12:10.72, placing seventh and gaining two team points. In the Distance Medley relay, Brooke Wilson, Taya Tucker, Jaiden Porter, and Casey Fry ran a 5:03.80, placing sixth and gaining three team points. In the Shuttle Hurdle relay, Kara Orcutt, Kailyn Hogan, Payton Beaman, and Shelby March ran a 1:17.69,



In the 400m hurdles, Brock Hillers ran a 1:00.65, placing second and gaining eight team points.

In the relay events, starting with the 4x100m relay, Mitchell Neuzil, Gianpaolo Pillon, Chad Neuzil, and Daniel Hunter ran a 45.57, placing second and gaining eight team points. In the 4x200m relay, Mitchell Neuzil, Evan Hoefer, Daniel Hunter,

and Derek Becker ran a 1:34.86, placing second and gaining eight team points. In the 4x400m relay, Derek Becker, Chance Downs, Brock Hillers, and Alex McCusker ran a 3:34.98, placing third and gaining six team points. In the 4x800m relay, Chance Downs, Derek Becker, Brenden Hogan, and Derek Mensen ran an 8:37.76, placing third and gaining six team points. In the Sprint Medley, Mitchell Neuzil, Zach Digman, Chad Neuzil, and Daniel Hunter ran a 1:42.30, placing fourth and gaining five team points. In the Distance Medley relay, Zach Digman, Evan Hoefer, Chance Downs, and Brenden Hogan ran a 3:53.36, placing fifth and gaining four team points. In the Shuttle Hurdle relay, Brock Hillers, Derek Becker, Tiege Hunt, and Chad Neuzil ran a 1:02.11, placing second and gaining eight team points.

The boys competed at Edgewood-Colesburg last night in their District Meet.

State qualifiers for both the boys and girls will become final later today hopefully. The state meet is next Thursday-Saturday at Drake University in Des Moines.


