For the homecoming game, the Wildcats worked their tails off, but the game ended with a score of 16-31 in the favor of the MFL MarMac Bulldogs.

Parker Sternhagen threw for 108 yards in 28 pass attempts. In those attempts Sternhagen made contact with A.J. Ambundo for 51 yards in 2 receptions, Trent Koopmann for 39 yards in 3 attempts, and Andrew Holtz for 18 yards in 3 receptions.

The team also had a great rushing game. Derek Becker led the pack with 116 rushing yards in 14 attempts, following was Sternhagen who kept the ball for 60 yards in 9 attempts, Zach Digman who went for 48 yards in 8 rush attempts, and Koopman gained 15 yards in two attempts.

The Wildcats found themselves in the endzone two times last Friday night. Becker and Sternhagen each scored a touchdown and two-point conversion for the team.

Defensively the game was exciting with an interception by Koopman and a fumble recovery by Sternhagen. The Wildcats tackling leaders for Friday night's game were Koopman with 15 tackles, Andrew Kloser with bringing down 10.5 tackles, Tim Harmon with 8 tackles, and Michael Feldmann with 6.5 tackles.

Kick off was handled by A.J. Ambundo, who kicked 121 yards in three attempts. Feldmann took care of punting needs, punting 59 yards in 2 attempts.

Cross country teams beat the rain and run at Jesup, West Delaware

It's been a rainy couple of weeks, but that hasn't put a damper on MV's cross country meets. Last Thursday the cross country teams traveled to Jesup to compete against some of Eastern Iowa's best 1A, 2A, and 3A runners.

The girls started the night off with senior Jaiden Porter and sophomores Emma Doyl and Kriya Atwell in the varsity race. Though they did not complete a full team for the varsity race, these three runners captured some of their best times of the year. Emma Doyl led the varsity Wildcats with a 38th place finish and a time of 21:50.1. Jaiden Porter was behind her at 22:28, earning a place of 51st. Kriya Atwell finished just behind her in 58th place and a time of 22:54.4.

Jordan Hogan, Annie Trenkamp, and Ci'Ann Richardson competed in the JV girls' race. Jordan finished first out of the girls, capturing a time of 28:22. Annie Trenkamp was shortly behind at a 29:37.7. Ci'Ann Richardson rounded out the girls' team with a time of 30:34.

The boys' side of the competition was interesting from start to finish. Running at nearly full strength the Wildcats put up an impressive 61 points and a close second-place finish behind 3A Waverly-Shell Rock (60). Cy Huber led the string of personal bests with a 4th place finish and a time of 17:25.1. Michael Schaul was close behind him with a time of 17:37 and an 11th place finish. The flood gates opened soon after that as Wildcat runner after Wildcat runner

came across the line. Ethan Doyl was next in 14th place at a time of 17:49.8. Runners Derek Mensen and Preston Roling finished together, going 17th and 18th for times of 17:55.8 and 17:56.5. Mason Lubben set a new personal best in 27th place with a time of 18:05.2. Nolan Ries completed the Varisty team with a 34th place finish in a time of 18:14.6.

In the JV boys competition, Landin Frasher and Brock Trenkamp ran for the Wildcats. Finishing back to back, Trenkamp led with a time of 20:29 for 24th place and Frasher with a 20:33 for 25th.

This past Tuesday the Maquoketa Valley Cross Country teams traveled to Manchester to compete in the West Delaware Invitational.

The Varsity Girls started the night off running Emma Doyl, Jaiden Porter, and Kriya Atwell. Emma finished first for the varsity girls at 31st place in a time of 22:26. Jaiden Porter was once again shortly behind in 33rd place in a time of 22:34. Kriya Atwell finished for the varsity girls at 56th place in a time of 23:35. Jordan Hogan competed in the JV girls' race for Wildcats, finishing 76th with a time of 27:15.9.

The Varsity boys ran a strong meet against the heavily loaded field of 1A, 2A, 3A, and 4A teams. The Wildcats finished 8th with a total of 201 points. Cy Huber led the boys with a 30th place finish and a time of 17:55.2. Michael Schaul was close behind, placing 33rd and claiming a time of 18:07.2. Nolan Ries and Derek Mensen finished together with Ries running 18:18.1

for 42nd place and Mensen running 18:20.6 for 47th. Just behind Derek was Ethan Doyl in 49th place with a time of 18:25.0. Mason Lubben ran 6th for the Wildcats, placing 55th overall with a time of 18:34.9. Preston Roling rounded out the Varsity Boys' team with a 19:01.6 and a 70th place finish.

Chance Downs, Landin Frasher, and Brock Trenkamp competed in the JV boys' race. Downs finished 5th overall with a time of 18:25.8. Brock Trenkamp and Landin Frasher finished side-by-side for the Wildcats going 60th and 61st. Trenkamp completed his race with a time of 20:47.7 and Frasher finished with a 20:49.2.

The Wildcat runners will compete again tomorrow at North Linn High School to conclude their regular season. Support your Cross Country Teams as they look to cap off an already impressive season!
