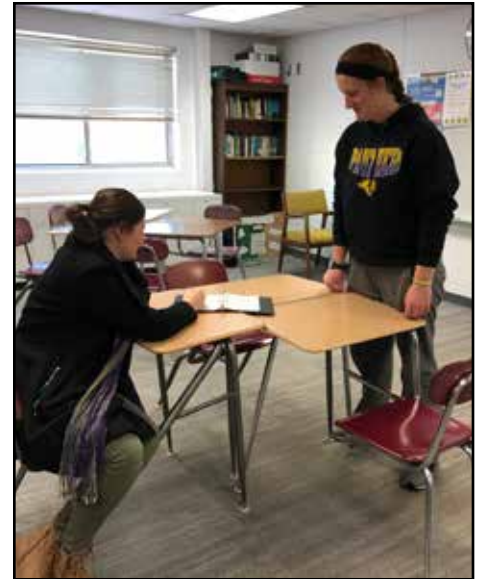

Girls basketball makes it to Regional Finals game

The Wildcats made a good run for the state tournament, but the Cascade Cougars' defense was too much for MV Monday night in the Regional Finals held at Dubuque Senior. MV lost 38-53. The team finished with a 20-3 overall record.

The path to the finals started last week with a win over East Buchanan Buccaneers on Wednesday night. Both teams came out swinging, but the Wildcats pulled through and finished the game with a great win 57-41. Coach Moenck commented, "East Buch is a team that came in playing really well. They are very well coached and have so many kids that can hurt you. We didn't get off to a good start and to East Buch's credit they came right at us to start the game. They killed us on the boards early and hit some very big shots."

By half time of the game 25-26 in the Buc's favor. The girls kept their cool and worked hard to get the lead. "To our kids credit, we never panicked. We kept chipping away and finally took the lead the rest of the game. We had a lot of kids really step up in this game. I'm so proud of our kids for just gutting it out. This time of year it is so important you play hard for 32 minutes," Coach Moenck continued. Sam Wall was the leading scorer of the night putting 19 points on the boards, with Em-

erson Whittenbaugh laying in 17 points for the team.

Offense is important, but defense can win you games. On the defensive end, Taya Tucker had 5 rebounds, and another 5 rebounds on the offensive side. Whittenbaugh also grabbed 7 total rebounds, and Maddy Anderegg pulled down 5.

Friday night the girls traveled to Manchester to take on the Beckman Blazers and won 46-38.

"Dyersville is another team that is extremely well coached," stated Coach Moenck. "They're such a big and physical team and we were not used to that. We didn't get off to a good start and Beckman came out and hit some really big shots. We were really concerned with their inside game and they came out and hit 5 3's to start the game. Again, to our teams credit, we didn't panic and kept chipping away and finally taking the lead late in the third period. We didn't shoot well in this game, and a lot of that had to do with Beckman doing a good job of keeping us off balance. We did a very nice job of being aggressive to the basket and getting to the F.T. line. This was a very big win for our kids and program. We have to do a better job of getting off to a better start the next game. I would like to thank the crowd that we had there Friday night. It was an awesome feel-
