Boys track team tears it up, sets new 800 medley record

Last Thursday, the Maquoketa Valley Boys Track Team traveled to Independence for a short yet successful night. At the conclusion of the meet, the Wildcats recorded a championship and scored a record number of points at 226 winning all seven relays and eight of the twelve individual events!

Starting the meet off right for the Wildcats was the long jumpers of AJ Ambundo and Devante Strickland. AJ finished runner-up with a jump of 17-07.00 while Devante finished 7th with a jump of 14-09.25.

AJ Ambundo also competed in the high jump where he placed second with a jump of 5-06.00.

In the discus Blake Becker claimed the title with a throw of 133-02. Brian Heims finished runner with a throw of 123-03. Andrew Hildebrand threw 104-03 for 5th place while Brock Trenkamp placed 7th at 97-07.

In the shot put Michael Feldmann was crowned champion with a throw of 44-04.00. Norman Wilson placed 2nd at 43-04.00 and Brian Heims placed 3rd at 43-01.00. Zach Digman and Alex Digman placed 5th and 7th throwing 41-04.00 and 39-10.00, respectively.

The running events kicked off with the 800 meter sprint medley relay of Chad Neuzil, Owen Mensen, Evan Hoefler, and Chance Downs. The medley were crowned champions while also setting a new school record at a time of 1:38.94.

Freshman Nolan Ries claimed the title in the 3200 meter run with a time of 11:34.49 Canyon Richardson finished 3rd with a time of 12:04.26.

In the 4x800 relay of Cy Huber, Michael Schaul, Landen Deutmeyer, and Mason Lubben, the Wildcats were also crowned champions with a time of 9:31.60.

The shuttle hurdle relay of Tim Harmon, James LeGassick, Teige Hunt, and Chad Neuzil placed first with a time of 1:08.14.

In the 100 meter dash Daniel Hunter placed the highest for the Wildcats at 3rd with a time of 11.97.

The Wildcats had two relays set in the 1600 meter medley with the team of Matthew Hucker, AJ Ambundo, James LeGassick, and Andrew Kloser winning it with a time of 4:06.24. The second team of Tim Harmon, Devante Strickland, Jon Seibert, and Preston Roling placed 3rd with a time of 4:21.34.

The Wildcats claimed another individual title in the 400 meter run as Derek Becker bested his time with a 52.18. Evan Hoefler also ran the 400 meter run placing

fourth with 55.21.

In the 4x200 relay, Maquoketa Valley once again ran two relays. The team of Daniel Hunter, Owen Mensen, AJ Ambundo, and Zach Digman placed third with a time of 1:39.68.

In the 110 meter hurdles Chad Neuzil placed first with a time of 16.13. Teige Hunt placed third with a 18.37 while Tim Harmon placed 5th with a 19.5.

In the 800 meter run Chance Downs placed first with a time of 2:11.78. Freshman Nolan Ries placed 4th with a time of 2:23.04 and Canyon Richardson placed 6th with a 2:32.57.

In the 200 meter dash, Matthew Hucker placed the highest for the Wildcats at fourth with a time of 25.20.

James LeGassick won the title in the 400 meter hurdles with a time of 59.61. Tim Harmon placed 5th with a 1:10.00.

In the 1600 meter run the Wildcats went 1 and 2 with Cy Huber claiming the title at 5:34.58 and Preston Roling finishing runner-up at 5:39.23.

The 4x100 relay of Daniel Hunter, Evan Hoefler, Chad Neuzil, and Owen Mensen continued the Wildcats' impressive night with a win at a time of 46.65. Additionally, a second team of Zach Digman, AJ Ambundo, Jon Seibert, and Devante Strickland placed 4th with a time of 50.00.

Wrapping the night up was the 4x400 relay. The first team of Andrew Kloser, Derek Becker, Teige Hunt, and Chance Downs claimed the title with a run of 3:44.36. The second team of Jon Seibert, Canyon Richardson, Mason Lubben, and Michael Schaul placed 5th with a time of 4:12.47.

This past Tuesday the Boys Track team also traveled to Jesup to compete in the J-Hawk Relays. The Wildcats finished 3rd with an accumulation of 90 points falling only to Jesup and Grundy Center

In the field events, AJ Ambundo started the Wildcats off in the high jump placing 9th at (5-04.00). In the long jump, James LeGassick finished 3rd with a jump of (20-1.50). AJ Ambundo finished 13th with a jump of (17-02.25). In the shot put, Brian Heims placed the highest for the Wildcats with a throw of (43-06.7). Michael Feldmann also placed finishing 6th with a throw of (41-08.75). In the discus Blake Becker finished runner-up with an impressive throw of (136-07.00). Brian Heims placed 7th at (119-04.50). In the running events, the Wildcats started their night off with a 5th place finish in the 800 meter sprint medley relay of Daniel Hunter, Chad Neuzil, Chance Downs, and Owen Mensen. Next, Michael Schaul placed 6th
