

This past Tuesday the Maquoketa Valley Boys Track Team traveled to Alburnett for a short yet competitive meet. This meet hosted local 1A teams in the Tri-Rivers Conference including North Linn, Alburnett, Central City, and East Buchanan as well as two 3A teams: Xavier and Iowa City Liberty. At the end of the meet which only lasted about 2 hours, the Wildcats finished second to Xavier with a total of 134 points.

In the field events, James LeGassick started things off in the long jump, placing 2nd with a jump of 19-10.75. Devante Strickland also jumped, placing 13th with a distance of 12-09.75

In the discus, Blake Becker finished second with a throw of 131-08. Brian Heims finished 4th at 117-09. Andrew Hildebrand placed 10th at 95-00.50 and Brock Trenkamp placed 13th at 90-05.75.

In the shot put, Brian Heims finished runner-up with a throw of 43-05.00 while finished 4th with a throw of 41-11.50. Zach Digman placed 6th at 40-09.50 and Alex Digman placed 10th at 38-04.50. Starting off the running events in the 800 medley was the first place team of Daniel Hunter, Evan Hoefer, Derek Becker, and Chance Downs at 1:38.34.

Up next, in the 3200 meter run Nolan Ries placed second with a time of 11:25.98 while Tate Trenkamp placed 5th at 12:06.94.

The 4x800 meter relay of Cy Huber, Mason Lubben, Preston Roling, and Michael Schaul say improvement last night, placing 4th with a time of 9:17.94.

The shuttle hurdle relay of Derek Becker, James LeGassick, Teige Hunt, and Chad Neuzil were crowned champions once again with a time of 1:02.64.

In the 100 meter dash, Daniel Hunter placed the highest for the Wildcats at 3rd with a time of 11.59. Zach Digman placed 7th with a time of 12.09, Owen Mensen placed 10th with a 12.29, and Ashton Goldsmith placed 17th with a 13.14.

The 1600 meter medley relay of Devante Strickland, Tim Harmon, Jon Seibert, and Andrew Kloser placed 5th with a time of 4:07.70.

Derek Becker finished second in the 400 meter dash with a time of 51.86. Mitch Heims also ran the 400 meter dash and placed 15th with a 1:07.28.

The varsity 4x200 meter relay of

Zach Digman, Teige Hunt, Evan Hoefer, and Owen Mensen placed second with a time of 1:38.56. The JV 4x200 meter relay of Preston Roling, Michael Schaul, Cy Huber, and Landen Deutmeyer placed 5th with a time of 1:43.29.

Chad Neuzil placed the highest for the Wildcats in the 110 meter high hurdles at 3rd with a time of 15.91. Brock Trenkamp placed 12th with a time of 23.85.

In the 800 meter run Chance Downs finished runner up with a time of 2:05.33. Tate Trenkamp placed 9th with a 2:22.19. Nolan Ries placed 11th with a 2:25.01 with teammate Landen Deutmeyer right behind him in 12th at 2:26.23.

In the 200 meter dash Daniel Hunter finished 4th with a time of 23.56.

James LeGassick was crowned champion in the 400 hurdles with an impressive time of 56.20. Tim Harmon also competed in the 400 hurdles, placing 12th at 1:07.53.

In the 1600 meter run, Derek Mensen placed 8th for the Wildcats at 5:44.42 while Mitch Heims placed 11th with a 5:48.85.

The varsity 4x100 meter relay of Daniel Hunter, Evan Hoefer, Chad Neuzil, and Owen Mensen finished runner up at a time of 45.71. The JV 4x100 meter relay of Zach Digman, Jon Seibert, Landen Deutmeyer, and Ashton Goldsmith finished 8th with a time of 50.27.

Rounding out the night were the 4x400 meter relays. The Varsity 4x400 of Derek Becker, Teige Hunt, James LeGassick, and Chance Downs placed second with a final time of 3:36.54. The JV 4x400 meter relay of Andrew Kloser, Cy Huber, Michael Schaul, and Mason Lubben finished 6th with a time of 3:58.61.
