Last Thursday the Maquoketa Valley Cross Country teams traveled to Anamosa for the Cascade Invitational. After a week of rain, Fillmore Fairways, the usual sight of the Cascade Invitational was deemed unfit to run on. In an attempt to keep the meet running, Anamosa offered to host the invitational with the same teams and order of competition.

The Wildcat girls started the night off with a 7th place finish and a total score of 173 points. Emma Doyl led the Wildcats placing 19th with a time of 22:57. Jaiden Porter was right behind her, finishing 21st with a time of 23:00. Next came Kriya Atwell at a time of 24:23 placing 33rd. Wrapping up the girls' team was Reece Mensen in 49th place at a time of 29:11 and Jordan Hogan in 51st with a time of 29:40.

On the boys' side of the competition, the Wildcats finished runner-up with a score of 50. Cy Huber led the Wildcats with an impressive time of 17:55. Chance Downs finished 2nd for the Wildcats and 10th overall with a time of 18:12. Right on his heels was Nolan Ries in 11th place with an 18:16 and Michael Schaul in 12th with an 18:21. Seniors Mason Lubben and Derek Mensen came in next with Lubben running an 18:44 and Mensen running an 18:55. Brock Trenkamp wrapped up the boys' team with a time of 20:35.

Last Friday night the Wildcats battled the Monticello Panthers under the lights. Although the final score was 14-21 in the favor of Monticello, don't be fooled by who dominated the game and clock.

Parker Sternhagen threw for 202 yards in 34 pass attempts. AJ Ambundo led in receiving yards with 92 yards in 4 receptions, Andrew Kloser followed with 59 yards in 5 attempts, Trent Koopmann with 27 yards in 2 attempts, Owen Mensen with 22 yards in 4 attempts, and Andrew Holtz gaining 2 yards in 1 reception.

The team also gained yards by playing a rushing game. The rushing leader for this game was Derek Becker with 47 yards in 15 attempts, Zach Digman with 28 yards in 13 attempts, Koopmann gained 25 yards in 6 attempts, and Sternhagen kept the ball for 7 yards in 3 rush attempts. The Wildcats worked their way into the endzone two times. Touchdowns were scored by Becker and Mensen. Becker also put a two-point conversion up on the boards last Friday night.

The game was also exciting on the defensive end of the game. Holtz intercepted 2 balls, and Mensen had an interception himself. Leading in tackles was Matthew Hucker with 7.5 tackles, Ambundo brought down 5 opponents, Tim Harmon with 4.5 tackles and Koopmann with 4 tackles.

Ambundo took on kickoff duties, kicking 75 yards in 3 attempts. Michael Feldmann took care of punting, kicking 136 yards in 4 punts.

Tonight the Wildcats will be traveling to Ed-Co's home field to battle the Vikings. The theme for tonight's football game will be white out. JV kickoff is to be at 5:45 with varsity to follow.

Last Thursday night, the Wildcats traveled to Cedar Valley Christian and lost all three matches with the scores of 13-25, 19-25, and 21-25.

Leading in kills were Taya Tucker with 10 followed by Lydia Helle with 8 and Payton Beaman with 6. Carissa Sabers led with 16 assists. Ella Imler led in digs with 14.. Kylie Chesnut and Helle had 3 blocks each. Imler led with 8 serves followed by Allie Knipper with 6 serves, both 100%.

This past weekend the Wildcats travel to West Delaware for tourney play.

The Wildcats lost against Vinton-Shellsburg with scores of 13-21 and 16-21. In the Vinton-Shellsburg match leading in kills were Tucker with 7 and Helle with 5. Sabers led with 10 assists. Imler led in digs with 15 and followed by Knipper and Sabers with 7. Lydia Helle led in blocks with 1. Chesnut and Imler had 5 serves with 100%.

Sabers led in assists with 14. Imler lead in digs with 25 followed by Sabers with 14 digs and Beaman with 7 digs. Tucker and Helle each had 2 blocks. Imler led with 11 serves followed by Knipper with 6 serves, both serving 100%

On Tuesday night the Wildcats played the Ed-Co Vikings winning 3 out of the 4 games with scores of 25-13, 25-13, 15-25, and 25-17.

In the Ed-Co match leading in kills were Emerson Whittenbaugh with 11 and Tucker with 10 kills. Sabers led with 18 assists. Imler led in digs with 16, followed by Whittenbaugh with 11 digs. Sabers and Tucker led blocks with 5. Sabers led in serves with 21.

Coach Whittenbaugh stated she was happy with the improvement of the girls blocking game. "It was a total team effort, but thought Taya Tucker did very well out of the middle for us Tuesday night, which was a difference maker." Coach Whittenbaugh stated, "Our serving was key for us as we recorded a number of aces serves. We need to focus on cutting out small runs that teams make on us and play better point for point."
