Healthy Lifestyle

Being physically active is essential to a healthy lifestyle. Just 30 minutes per day for adults and 60 minutes per day for children is all it takes. Does that sound to difficult? Well, it's easier than you may think. Here is how I got started and have stayed committed for over three years.

When I turned in my resignation for coaching Speech, Mr. Tuetken came and asked if I would be willing to organize something, fitness related, for our staff. I had recently been to a bootcamp workout session. I began to wonder, could I continue to do this type of workout with staff? Where would we have it, what would be the hours, who would come, how would I promote it, and how would I figure out the routines to do every day?

I knew that another coworker attended this type of workout in Manchester. I had many questions, so of course I sought out information from her and others who were actively doing this kind of workout plan as well as from the internet. I had yet to publicize that we'd be starting this when a couple of staff came to me and said they would be interested, and so our story began September 2015.

Since that time, 7 people have been dedicated to weekly attendance since that first early September morning. Along the way, some have come and gone and come back again. Others have just come and gone. There is always room for newcomers, no matter their current fitness level. This is open to any and all staff at Maquoketa Valley.

The group that I lead meets M-W in Delhi, T-Th in Hopkinton, and we rotate every other Friday. Each class is from 5:30-6:30 AM. Not a morning person? No problem. Another teacher leads a class in Hopkinton M-Th afternoons from 4-5. Also, Erika Imler has a store front fitness establishment called HIKE. This is in Delhi and she has AM and PM class times. Regular Board Meeting

March 26, 2018

The regular meeting of the Maquoketa Valley Board of Education was called to order by President John Zietlow at 6:00 p.m. in the High School Conference Room in Delhi, Iowa. All motions carried unanimously unless otherwise noted. Five board members were present. There were five staff and one visitor present. The agenda and consent items were approved.

The Board reviewed and approved the 2018-2019 budget estimate as presented for publication and set the budget hearing for April 9, 2018 at 5:15 p.m. in the Middle School Conference Room. The estimate sets the proposed tax rate at \$10.57761 which is a decrease of \$.01 from the 2017-2018 levy rate.

Four open enrollment requests out and five open enrollment requests in were approved.

Board policy series 400 was reviewed and approved.

The Board approved a bid in the amount of \$86,985 from Hoglund Bus for the purchase of a 71-passenger school bus which will be delivered after July 1st. SAVE dollars will be used to purchase this bus.

The following operation sharing agreements for the 2018-2019 school year were approved:

The Board approved the 2018-2019 school calendar.

The Academic Excellence Banquet is scheduled for May 9th. Dr. Jeffrey Butikofer will be the guest speaker for the banquet.

At 6:51 p.m. in a motion by Dabroski, seconded by Feldmann the Board entered into a closed session pursuant to Chapter 20.17 (3) of the Code of Iowa for a collective bargaining strategy session. A roll call vote was answered as follows: Dabroski, Feldmann, Huber, Kunde, Zietlow; all ayes. Carried.

At 7:06 p.m. the Board entered into open session.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:07 p.m.

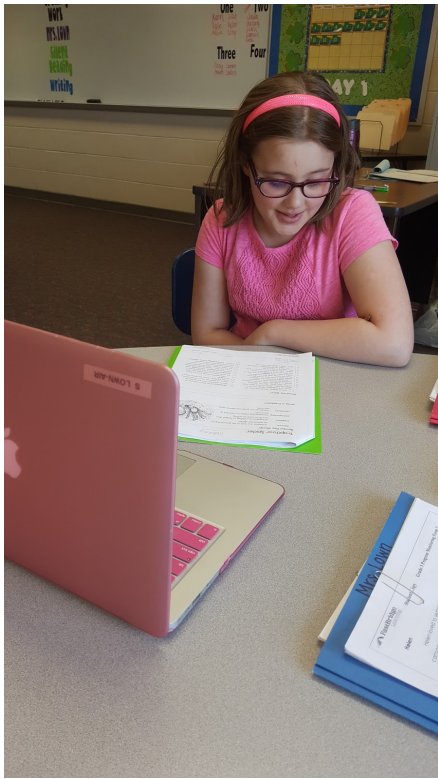

Students Use Technology to Build Reading Skills

Third grade students in my room have been using technology to help them become better readers. The students read a passage aloud while the computer records their speaking. When they are finished, they replay their “cold” recording to count their errors, calculate words per minute and grade themselves on their expression. After discussing their scores with me and talking through ways to improve, they practice reading the passage five times to themselves.



Then, they are ready to record their “hot” read. Finally, the same calculations are configured and they are able to see their improvement. The recordings are saved to a laptop to either go back and listen to or compare their “hot” read with another student’s “hot” read of the same passage. This allows students to discuss and peer assess each other's reading strengths. The students are enjoying the opportunity to use technology to improve their reading skills!

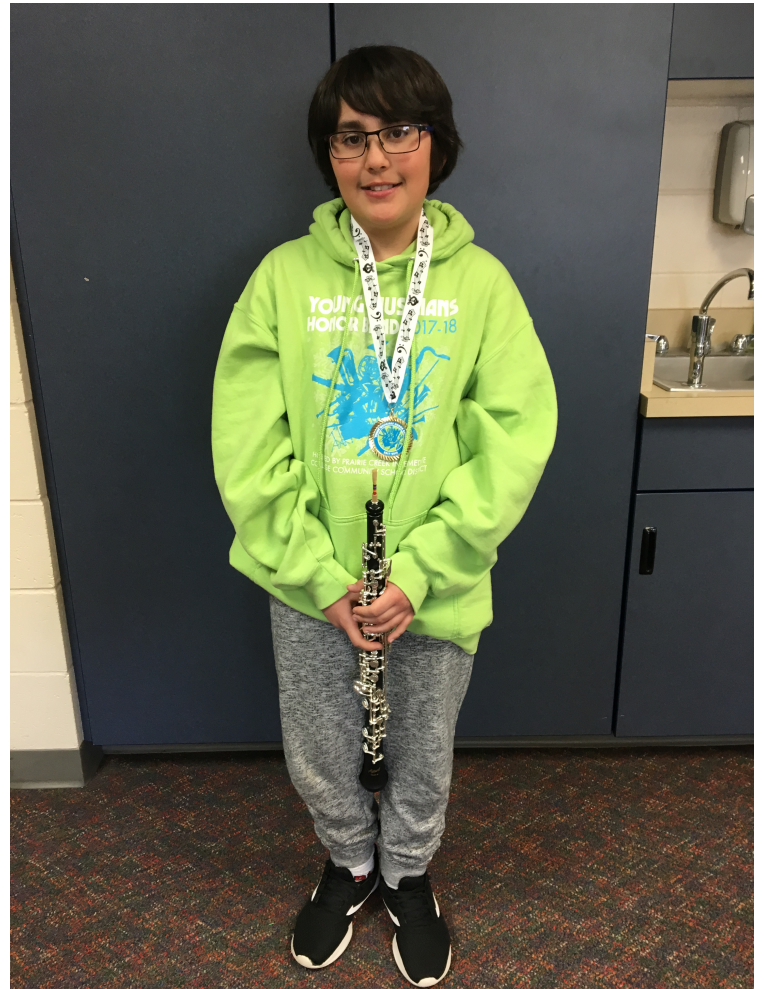
