Welcome Back

With the beginning of a new school year, it is always a time in which student and staff expectations and enthusiasm runs high. It also seems to coincide with a number of changes. This year is no exception. With the retirement of Marla Wulfekuhle, Jane Mesch, Ken Hart, and the departure of Tiffany Feldmann and Brittany Hoefer, changes will be occurring. Hollinrake will move from High School Guidance/Media Center to Elementary/Middle School Guidance and Jill McDermott will expand her guidance experience to the Middle School to help Ms. Hollinrake. Beth Zietlow will transfer to the kindergarten classroom to replace Mrs. Mesch. Kris Wilson will be moving to 3rd grade at Johnston and Raechel Keltner will replace Ms. Hoefer and become the 4-Year Old Preschool instructor at Johnston and Earlville. Larry Meyer will move into Mrs. Feldmann's PE position and Kevin Kudrna will pick up an additional PE class at the high school. Dawn Smeins will move from Earlville and become the elementary secretary at Delhi. In order to generate additional funding from the state due to new sharing legislation, Ann Norton will be the Curriculum Specialist and School Improvement Coordinator for our district and Central City. With Mrs. Norton assuming a new leadership role, Brenda Becker will oversee the principal responsibilities for Earlville and Johnston. North Linn was in need of additional business manager services so for one day a week Erika Imler, the district's Business Manager will provide this support.

As most of us realize, for a number of years our district has experienced enrollment fluctuations. This continues to cause changes in our elementary centers. Due to these variations, and with the increased number of curricular mandates, coupled with the insufficient funding from the state, in order to meet the needs of *all* of our children at Maquoketa Valley, we will continue to see multiple changes in the delivery of education in the foreseeable future. It has been my experience that at times we have a tendency to take for granted how exceptional and how hard every single employee at Maquoketa Valley works for all of our children. But with all the changes within our district and at the district level, I believe we need to be proactive to address our enrollment fluctuations in order to be more consistent. With that said, our district will be forming a steering committee comprised of community members, teachers, administrators, and Board members to explore some possible options to address our needs. Obviously no decisions will be made without a large-scale attempt to solicit community input.

Speaking of changes, this past winter our District applied for the new Teacher Leadership and Compensation Grant. Unfortunately we were unable to secure the grant. It is a difficult process, but we will again apply this fall. If we are fortunate enough to receive the grant this will also bring about significant changes for the 2015 – 2016 school year. Without going into all the details, this new Teacher Leadership System allows teachers to take on additional leadership responsibilities in the district for additional compensation and possibly less time in the classroom. So stay tuned for additional information in the very near future.

This past year I had the opportunity to not only serve our great district as Superintendent of Schools, but I also took on some High School Principal responsibilities. Overall, we had an exceptional year at the high school due to the leadership of our senior class combined with the leadership of our faculty and staff. Discipline referrals were significantly decreased from 2012 – 2013 to the 2013 – 2014 school year. Bully and harassment complaints/investigations were also down during this same time period. Fewer students received failing grades and we experienced a decrease in our overall dropout percentage. I expect even better results with the leadership of our incoming senior class. Scholarships granted from area institutions and the Dollars for Scholars increased. Even with all of this success, I was disappointed, and sometimes shocked,

by the underlying current of indifference as it related to homework completion. *This is where we really need your help if* you have a middle school or high school student. Most of us realize, and research confirms this, that there is a tendency for parent involvement to decrease at the secondary level as it relates to academics. From my standpoint, I believe it is crucial that as the parent, you continue to stay involved. Research has shown over and over that parent involvement contributes significantly to your children's education. So I am asking that as a parent you stay or become proactive and do the following:

- Before the school year begins, visit with your child and set expectations and consequences about homework completion.
- With your child, regularly (multiple times during the week) visit the PowerSchool website located on our district website to discuss with your child their grades, homework assignments and their plan to complete assignments on time.
- Follow-up with our instructors if you have any question about assigned work.
- Set-aside time each evening to have your child "unplug" from their technology to complete their homework.

The bottom line is, show consistent interest in your child and their future and do not ever hesitate to contact school personal at any time to discuss your child's education. Years of research and common sense tell us that if you are involved in your child's education your child's chance for academic and post high school success increases dramatically. So it is critical that you partner with us to help your child succeed.

All of us are extremely excited about the 2014 – 2015 school year. Due to enrollment fluctuations, changes in instructional delivery due to the Iowa Core Curriculum, and state economic conditions, the face of education continues to change. We all realize that change can be daunting, but in the end, the world continues to move towards a more technological and global society. Because of this, it is imperative that we remain flexible and continue to expand our collaboration efforts with one another in order to instruct, guide, encourage, and at times, push our children to excel. Our district is extremely fortunate to employ people that truly care about your children and understand that our society and children are constantly changing and are willing to change and adapt in order to meet the needs of all of our students. But again, we cannot do this alone. We need your help!

If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to give me a call, drop an email, or stop by to visit. The doors to Maquoketa Valley will always be open for the parents and patrons of this district.

Registration and 2014-15 School Fees

Registration of students and payment of fees will be <u>Tuesday, August 5 & Wednesday, August 6</u> from 10:00 AM until 6:00 PM. This year, registration will take place both days **in DELHI only** at the Middle School and High School. You may register all your children in Delhi at the same time, no matter what building they attend this school year.

Opening day of school will be Thursday, August 14, 2014. The normal school day hours are 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM.

Feel free to do your registration on line, then you would not need to come in to the school and would be able to do it at your own convenience. The extra online registration fee will be waived August 5th through August 11th. Computers and staff will be available at the school to assist with registration. Free/Reduced lunch forms will also be available at the school. Once again the parents will be able to pay their 2014–15 school year student fees, submit lunch money and update contact and emergency information on PowerSchool. Parents may do the registration from home or come to school on the dates listed to complete registration and pay all fees. Parents are encouraged to pay fees using our online payment system. Student fees and hot lunch deposits may be paid this way, charging fees to your personal debit or credit account.

When you register on line, and are buying the Assignment Book (for 3rd - 8th graders), you will need to have your child stop in at their school's office to pick up their assignment book the first day of school.

On August 5 & 6, school personnel will be on hand to assist with the registration process or assist with E-Registration. The e-Registration has been improved so you may now update information for one child and that will transfer to all children in that family enrolled in school. It is important for parents to update email addresses, as most school notices are now sent via email, notifying parents of early dismissals, makeup information, etc. A link is located on the school website for payment of registration fees and the PowerSchool link to update student information.

Families new to MV, please bring come to school for Registration and bring the social security numbers of your child/ren. The school is required to have it on file. Remember, each 3rd – 8th grade student will need an MV assignment notebook. For those families who apply for Free or Reduced meals, we ask that you please come to school on either of the two registration dates, that way we can help you with the application process. Check the supplies list later in this newsletter for classroom supplies.

If you choose to take the fee waiver, just sign and date the Waiver Statement which is located o the second page of the Free or Reduced meals application. Also, check the second page of the application for children's health insurance offered by the State of lowa called **hawk-i**.

Regular Board Meeting

June 16, 2014

The regular meeting of the Maquoketa Valley Board of Education was called to order by Vice President Chris Huber at 7:00 p.m. in the Middle School Conference Room in Delhi, Iowa. All motions carried unanimously unless otherwise noted. Four board members were present. There were four staff and one visitor present. The agenda and the consent items were approved.

In Principals and Coordinators reports, it was noted that new locker have been ordered from School Specialty for the senior hall in the high school. These will be installed this summer. Lock systems for the doors at Earlville and Johnston will also be installed during the summer.

Two new buses have been ordered. These will arrive in August and placed on routes when school starts.

The Board called for bread and milk bids for the 2014-2015 school year to be approved at the July meeting.

Board Secretary, Erika Imler, was authorized to pay bills owed yet this fiscal year prior to June 30th.

The following personnel recommendations were approved: Raechel Keltner - employed as MS VB Coach

Student fees and prices for the 2014/2015 school year were reviewed. A ten cent increase was approved for breakfast, K-5 lunch, 6-12 lunch, second entree and adult lunch. A five cent increase was approved for extra milk. Driver's education will increase \$5.00. Musical instrument rent will also increase \$10.00. All other fees and prices will remain the same. The Board reviewed the IASB Legislative Action Priorities and will begin the process of choosing the District's top five priorities for 2014/2015. Supt. Tuetken took a few minutes to discuss the board goal setting process and presented the Director's with information on previous Board goals and Superintendent goals. Further discussion on this process will take place at the July meeting. Donna Kunde was recently selected to serve on IASB's Legislative Resolutions Committee. Donna recently attended her first meeting and took a few minutes to update the board on the outcome of the meeting as well as her responsibilities as a member of this committee. Supt. Tuetken applied for and received a DRA Grant of \$5,000. This grant will be used to purchase and install a security camera system for the Delhi Elementary and Middle School. Supt. Tuetken presented the board with the Instructional Support Levy time line. Every five years as required by law, the board is required to go through a systematic process in order to renew the Instructional Support Levy. The board will begin this process in July.

The meeting adjourned at 7:47 p.m.
