## The Wildcat Way- Let's Celebrate!

Be Respectful! Be Responsible! Be Safe! These 3 statements are the foundation of the Wildcat Way, our school wide behavior system for grades preschool through eighth grade. Students were introduced to the Wildcat Way behavior expectations at the beginning of the 2015-2016 school year. They learned and practiced the proper behavior for many areas of the school including the lunchroom, playground, bus, classroom, and hallways. These expectations were reviewed throughout last school year and were reintroduced at the beginning of the current school year. Now, it is time to celebrate!

It is time to celebrate how well our students are demonstrating the proper behavior throughout the school. Yeah!!! They understand what is necessary to be respectful, to be responsible, and to be safe. Way to go!!! Students understand there are certain expectations in certain areas so they can be respectful, responsible, and safe. Awesome!!! If a student makes a mistake in his/her behavior, he/she is able to identify which of the three main principals of behavior the behavior doesn't support. Super!!!

Moving to a school wide behavior system has given all staff and students a common language to refer to when discussing behavior. The expectations are consistent from building to building and from grade level to grade level. This has been extremely beneficial as students move between teachers and some of our teachers move among the buildings. No matter which teacher they have or what building they are in, the students understand they need to be respectful, responsible, and safe and have clearly defined expectations to help them demonstrate these important character traits.

On the evening of November 2, Maquoketa Valley was a satellite location for Keystone AEA as they hosted Tricia Wells, one of the top ten experts on discipline in the country. The message Ms. Wells presented goes hand in hand with the Wildcat Way. Ms. Wells explained how important having clear expectations are for children, both at home and at school, and taking the time to teach these expectations to them. ## Regular Board Meeting

November 21, 2016

Prior to the board meeting, Roger Worm, of OPN, updated the Board on the high school renovation plans, estimates cost of the project and scheduling.

The regular meeting of the Maquoketa Valley Board of Education was called to order by President John Zietlow at 6:58 p.m. in the Middle School Conference Room in Delhi, Iowa. All motions carried unanimously unless otherwise noted. Five board members were present. There were nine staff members present and eight visitors present. The agenda and consent items were approved.

Senator Zumbach and Representative Hein updated the Board on several educational topics. This included revenue projections, state supplemental aid, expanded uses of PPEL and Management Funds, transportation costs and mental health funding. Amy Holst, from Keystone AEA, presented information on ACES which staff viewed at a professional development day in September.

The 2017-2018 SBRC Modified Allowable Growth for Dropout Prevention was approved. The Board approved the maximum amount allowed by state law.

The 2016-2017 SBRC Application for Open Enrollment Out for \$73,484.40 was approved. This will allow the district to increase spending authority and to levy dollars if needed due to the increase cost in the difference between last year's open enrolled students.

The Board approved the following district depositories as well as a depository limit of \$10,000,000: Heritage Bank, Community Savings Bank, F&M Bank and Citizens State Bank.

The following personnel recommendation was approved:  
Randy Darrow — employed as High School Night Custodian

The board policy series 900 was reviewed and approved. The board also approved the districts participation in the Iowa Drug and Alcohol Testing Program designed for bus drivers.

A special meeting will be scheduled for the first week of December to approve the bell, phone and intercom bids.

Board policy series 1000 will be reviewed and approved in December.

The December board meeting will be held at Earlville Elementary on December 19<sup>th</sup> beginning at 6:00 p.m.

Suggestions for the featured speaker for the 2017 Academic Excellence Banquet were discussed and noted.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:12 p.m.
