## 6-12 Principal Report

### **Perseverance / Work Ethic:**

Persevering is refusing to give up in the face of adversity, no matter how difficult the task. This characteristic is mentioned most frequently by the business world. Employers, for obvious reasons, are looking for people with a strong work ethic and who can persevere and problem solve when times get tough. At Maquoketa Valley our staff sets high expectations, and students are taught how to persevere and develop a work ethic in the classroom as well as through our extra-curricular offerings.

### **Responsibility:**

Responsibility is keeping promises, meeting obligations, and being accountable for your actions. This characteristic is critical to develop in all aspects of life. We expect our students to come prepared and complete work on time, ask for help when needed, take care of their property as well as others', and accept their mistakes. Our staff does a great job of setting high expectations and teaching students how to be responsible.

### **Respect:**

Respect is being courteous to others through actions and words and treating others the way you want to be treated. At Maquoketa Valley our staff teaches students to accept decisions of those in authority, calmly share disagreements, thoughtfully look at and listen to others, use appropriate language, greet others, and take pride in themselves.

### **Integrity:**

Integrity is using an internal set of ethical values to guide the decision making process. Our staff stresses the importance of being honest and admitting and owning up to mistakes. We understand that students are going to make mistakes, and our staff uses this as an opportunity to teach students better ways to handle certain situations.

### **Motivation:**

Motivation is being eager to act and work appropriately. At Maquoketa Valley we encourage our students to get involved in extracurricular activities, be productive in the classroom environment, exhibit body language that displays positive energy, and attend class regularly and on time. Our staff expects students to be engaged in the classroom, as well as ask questions to seek help or further understanding in the content.

## **Regular Board Meeting**

November 27, 2017

The regular meeting of the Maquoketa Valley Board of Education was called to order by President John Zietlow at 5:00 p.m. in the High School Conference Room in Delhi, Iowa. All motions carried unanimously unless otherwise noted. Four board members were present. There were five staff members present and six visitors present. The agenda and consent items were approved.

The 2018-2019 SBRC Modified Allowable Growth for Dropout Prevention was approved. The Board approved the maximum allowed by state law.

The 2017-2018 SBRC Application for Open Enrollment Out of \$52,728 was approved. This will allow the district to increase spending authority and to levy dollars if needed due to the increase cost in the difference between last year's and this year's open enrolled students.

The Board approved the following district depositories as well as depository limits of \$10,000,000: Heritage Bank, Community Savings Bank, F&M Bank and Citizens State Bank.

The following personnel recommendation was approved in a motion by Huber, seconded by Feldmann:  
Ann Grant – Letter of Assignment for Large Group Speech

The board policy series 200 was reviewed and approved. The board also approved the districts participation in the Iowa Drug and Alcohol Testing Program designed for bus drivers.

One open enrollment in was approved.

The Board approved the 2017-2018 Voluntary Early Separation of Certified Staff. The \$54,000 will be paid in three equal installments of \$18,000 and deposited into a Health Reimbursement Arrangement Account.

Board policy series 300 will be reviewed and approved in December.

Suggestions for the featured speaker for the 2018 Academic Excellence Banquet were discussed and noted.

The December board meeting will be held at Earlville Elementary on December 20<sup>th</sup> beginning at 6:00 p.m.

Discussion took place regarding the property to the west of the school in Earlville. Supt. Tuetken has been asked if the district would consider leasing or selling this property to the Earlville Little League. Supt. Tuetken will contact Thomas Hanson regarding this property.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:50 p.m.

Immediately following the board meeting, Senator Dan Zumbach, Representative Lee Hein and Representative Louie Zumbach along with the Monticello Board of Education and Supt. Brian Jaeger, joined the Maquoketa Valley Board of Education, Supt. Doug Tuetken and Erika Imler to conduct a legislative work session. Topics discussed included extending the state one cent sales tax past the 2029 sunset, state supplemental aid, expanded uses of the Management Fund and other categorical funds, transportation costs and mental health funding.



## Band Bash

On Tuesday, November 20, the Maquoketa Valley Bands gathered for our annual Band Bash. The Bash brought together band students in grades 5-12. The night was filled with games, music, and fun. The older students were able to teach the younger ones a few short tunes. By the end of the evening everyone joined together to play the "Let's Go Cats" cheer and the theme from "Seven Nation Army". It was a fun night to hang out, make friends, and enjoy playing music together!



## What's Happening in Kindergarten

This time of year is when things really start to pick up in Kindergarten. The students have completed their Jolly Phonics program where they learn all of the letter sounds. We are now getting into blending those sounds together to read and write words. It is always so fun to see how excited to kids get when they can read a word, a sentence, and then a whole book to themselves!! In math we have finished learning about numbers 0-10. We have also learned to compare numbers and the students understand the concepts of greater than, less than and the same. We will do a unit on 2 and 3 dimensional shapes before winter break and when we return from break we will begin a unit on addition and subtraction. In science we are in the middle of a unit on animals. The students are learning about goldfish, guppies, snails, worms and pill bugs. It is a very hands on unit and the students love having the animals here at school where they can observe them daily.

## Greetings from fourth grade!

When students in my class were asked what experiences have been valuable to them so far this school year, I received many responses. Some of the most-valued experiences included Literacy Rotations, Read Aloud time, and eating lunch in the classroom. During Literacy Rotations, students enjoy both the challenges of independent work and the rich conversations with their reading groups. Read Aloud is also a very treasured time of the day. Most of the students reported that their favorite book so far is *Where the Red Fern Grows*. Another ritual we enjoy is eating lunch and reading independently in the classroom on Fridays. We are looking forward to making many more great memories throughout the year!

## **Northeast Iowa Community College, Maquoketa Valley partner on career fair**

DELHI—The junior class at Maquoketa Valley High School had the opportunity to participate in the second annual career fair held at the high school on Oct. 30.

Facilitators Debbie DeVore and Audrey Moenck with Maquoketa Valley, along with Holly Maurer and Marsha Herzog with Northeast Iowa Community College (NICC), were thrilled to partner on this event for the second year.

With Holly Maurer, Manchester Center center director, and Marsha Herzog, NICC High School Partnerships, DeVore and Moenck explored career exploration activities for the students at the high school event. On Oct. 17 Maurer and Herzog met with the juniors to discuss ways to prepare for an interview, appropriate dress, questions to ask of potential employers and body language, as well as telephone and email etiquette. The students learned from this prep session and applied it at the career fair.

Twenty professionals in various industries volunteered their time, energy and talents to meet with the junior class in a “speed-dating” style career fair. The professionals included a farmer, U.S. National Guard member, owner of an auto body shop, pilot, principal, marketing director, nurse, physical therapist, radiographer, midwife, dietitian, hygienist, city clerk, electrician, counselor, cosmetologist, construction company and engineer. These professionals were selected based upon career interest areas the junior class had expressed.

“This event truly does allow the juniors to explore career pathways and, as a result, provides insights that help to decide whether to pursue or eliminate a career option. Either way, this is a success; students can focus on a pathway they are most interested in,” explained Manchester Center Director Maurer.
