Maquoketa Valley Dollars for Scholars® Creating Lasting Impact

May, 22, 2019 (Delhi, Iowa) - The Dollars for Scholars® program distributed \$106,700 at the Senior

Awards Ceremony on Sunday, May 5th. The mission of the Maquoketa Valley Dollars for Scholars® is to encourage graduating seniors to further their training and education to provide opportunities for career and other life goals. The Maquoketa Valley chapter will seek donations to support this mission and be responsible stewards to provide the most help possible for graduates of Maquoketa Valley High School, now and for future generations.

The Dollars for Scholars® Program has given \$771,564 in total scholarships throughout a nineteenyear span to 917 Maquoketa Valley graduates. Dollars for Scholars® serves any student who applies, not just the top students in the class. On average, the program awards \$2,000 to any given student. This year 194 scholarships were presented, granting students four or five scholarships and gifting them with \$1,910-\$3,010 each.

The Dollars for Scholars® program came to life in 1999 and is built on endowments. Major contributor, Arvin Cooper, said, "Kids are our future and they need an education. It is my hope that once the graduates receiving these scholarships are established and doing well, they will return the favor and contribute to Maquoketa Valley Dollars for Scholars®." Cooper has now built something much bigger, beginning in 2019 the Dollars for Scholars® offered the first renewable scholarship program. The Arvin Cooper Renewable Scholarship Program offers qualifying students up to four years of assistance in completing their college education.

The Dollars for Scholars® program sets Maquoketa Valley a part from any other school district. "I do not have the words to accurately express how amazing this is for our students and families. I am extremely grateful for the hundreds and hundreds of hours of personal time that the Dollars Board of Directors give to this program. I am also amazed by the generous donations and contributions from our families and area businesses as they invest in our kids and their futures. But this is what makes Maquoketa Valley not only unique, but also great. It is truly about our kids and everyone in our school community understands this," stated Superintendent Doug Tuetken.

The regular meeting of the Maquoketa Valley Board of Education was called to order by President John Zietlow at 7:30 a.m. in the High School Conference Room in Delhi, Iowa. All motions carried unanimously unless otherwise noted. Five board members were present. There were two staff members present. The agenda items were approved.

The Board was presented with information regarding the 2019-2020 collective bargaining settlement. The Board discussed and shared thoughts regarding this settlement. The Board approved the 2019-2020 collective bargaining settlement which equated to a 3.20% increase.

At 7:36 a.m. in a motion by Kunde, seconded by Huber the Board entered into a closed session pursuant to Chapter 21.9 of the Iowa Code for the purpose of discussing strategy in matters relating to employment conditions of employees of the school who are not covered by the collective bargaining agreement. A roll call vote was answered as follows: Dabroski, Feldmann, Huber, Kunde, Zietlow; all ayes. Carried.

At 7:47 a.m. the Board entered into open session.

The Board approved the following salary adjustments:

Classified Staff: average salary increase of 2.0% plus step movement

Administrative Staff: salary increase of 2.6%

The meeting was adjourned at 7:49 a.m.

Regular Board Meeting

May 23, 2019

The regular meeting of the Maquoketa Valley Board of Education was called to order by President John Zietlow at 5:30 p.m. in the High School Conference Room in Delhi, Iowa. All motions carried unanimously unless otherwise noted. Three board members were present. There were five staff members present and one visitors present. The agenda and consent items were approved.

Due to the ash borer disease, any tree that is located on the Delhi campus will be removed. This work will be done over the summer.

Preschool round-up was held on April 24th, as of that date there were 50 preschoolers signed up for the 2019/2020 school year.

Kindergarten graduation will take place on May 28th at 1:30. An open house will be held beginning at 12:30.

The Board approved the call for bread and milk quotes for the 2019/2020 school year.

The following personnel recommendations were approved:

The Board approved the following Return-to-Play and Learn Protocol Resolution:

WHEREAS, Concussions are a type of brain injury that can range from mild to severe and can disrupt the way the brain normally works. Concussions can occur with or without loss of consciousness. *Iowa Code* 280.13C(1)(b)

WHERAS, Concussions are among the most commonly reported injuries to children and adolescents who participate in recreational activities. Continuing to engage in activities with a concussion or symptoms of a brain injury leaves a young athlete vulnerable to greater injury. *Iowa Code* 280.13C(1)(a)(c)

WHERAS, Concussions can impair how a student athlete thinks, acts, feels and learns. A Student who has sustained a concussion may need adjustments, modifications to curriculum and monitoring by medical staff until the student is fully recovered. *Iowa Code* 280.13C(1)(d)

WHEREAS, The Maquoketa Valley Community School District has developed a return-to-play and learn protocol based on the consistent with guidelines from the Iowa Department of Health and the Iowa Athletic Association, for a student's return to participation in any extracurricular interscholastic activity after showing signs, symptoms or behaviors consistent with a concussion or brain injury. *Iowa Code* 280.13C(6)(a)

NOW THEREFORE, LET IT RESOLVED, that Maquoketa Valley Board of Education formally adopts the return-to-play and learn protocol established by the District as the appropriate protocol for Maquoketa Valley. *Iowa Code* 280.13C(6)(a)

The Board approved the Kirkwood Community College Concurrent Partnership Agreement for the 2019/2020 school year.

Board policy 501.08 Wellness Policy was reviewed. A modification to the recess time from 20 minutes to 15 minutes was made to reflect current practice. Board policy 204.020 Regular School Board Meetings was also reviewed. Beginning in July 2019, the regular school board meeting date will move from the 4th Monday of each month to the 3rd Monday of each month. Board policy 1004.011 RI ICN Usage Policy was also reviewed. This policy will be rescinded due to no longer having an ICN room. The Board approved the board policies and waived the second readings and adopted policy 501.08 and 204.020 on the first official reading and rescinded policy 1004.011.

The Board granted the Business Manager and Superintendent the authority to accept the Natural Gas Bid for the 2019/2020 school year.

Supt. Tuetken presented the Board with information regarding the 2019 Legislative Resolutions. The Board will review these and then vote on the district priorities at a later meeting.

Once again, there will be many summer projects that will be completed during the break. The concrete in front of the high school will be replaced as well as the asphalt in front of the high school. Lighting in the high school will continued to be replaced with LED lighting. The Earlville gym roof will be replaced as well as replacing the carpet in the hallways and office area. The entrance at the Delhi Campus will be modified to resemble the vestibule at the High School. Finally, the Johnston Controls heating system will be upgraded in the Delhi Elementary/Middle School.

The June meeting will be held on Thursday, June 20th and will begin at 5:30 p.m. in the High School Conference Room.

At 6:17 p.m. in a motion by Huber, seconded by Kunde the Board entered into a closed session pursuant to Chapter 21.9 of the Code of Iowa for the purpose of discussing strategy matters relating to employment conditions of employees of the school who are not covered by the collective bargaining agreement. A roll call vote was answered as follows: Huber, Kunde, Zietlow; all ayes. Carried.

At 6:20 p.m. the Board entered into open session.

The Board approved 75% of a single health insurance policy for the Delhi Elementary Secretary.

The meeting adjourned at 6:21 p.m.

Using E-Registration and Online Payment of Fees

Once again the parents will be able to pay their 19-20 school year student fees, submit lunch money and update contact and emergency information on Powerschool. Student registration will take place August 12, 2019 from 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. in the High School Cafeteria.

Parents may do the registration from home or welcome to come to the school on the date listed to complete registration and pay all fees. Parents are also being encouraged to pay all student fees using an online payment system. Student fees and hot lunch deposits may be paid this way, charging fees using debit or credit accounts. School personnel will be on hand to assist with the registration process or assist with E-Registration. The E-Registration has been updated that you may now update information in one child and will transfer to all children enrolled in school. It is important for parents to update e-mail addresses, as notices are sent via email notifying parents of early dismissals, makeup information, etc.

A link is located on the school website for payment of registration fees and the Powerschool link to update student information. These will be active beginning August 9, 2019.



Requirements

All students entering, advancing or transferring into 7th grade and born after September 15, 2004, will need proof of one dose of meningitis vaccine. All students entering, advancing, or transferring into 12th grade and born after September 15, 1999, will need proof of two doses of meningitis vaccine; or 1 dose if received when the student was 16 years of age or older. Proof of this vaccine will need to be provided PRIOR to the start of the first day of school or at school registration. In addition to the meningitis vaccine for those entering into 7th grade they will also be required to provide proof of Tdap vaccine. Please contact your health care provider, Delaware County Public Health at 563-927-7551, or Nurse Mary.

Where the injury took place, that led to a concussion, is not relevant. The objective of the policy/protocol is to make sure that the student is well enough to return to play, if in athletics, and that they are ready to return to learn in the classroom.

If your child is in grade 7-12, they will need to do a baseline symptom checklist, along with their physical exam, in order to be eligible to take part in the extracurricular activity. These forms can be obtained at school, on the school's website, or from your child's coach.
