Learning responsibility yields lifelong rewards for students

Educators agree that responsible children do better in school. Luckily, parents have countless opportunities to teach responsibility—and more influence on their children than anyone else!

To build responsibility:

Use rules and consequences. Enforce a few age-appropriate rules and consequences. State them in easy-to-understand language so your child knows exactly how to behave.

Trust your child with tasks. School-age kids are capable of handling responsibilities such as picking up their rooms and helping you with the laundry.

Let your child make decisions, such as which homework assignment to tackle first. Making decisions builds confidence.

Talk about financial responsibility. Many kids receive an allowance or are paid for extra chores. This is a great opportunity to teach about budgeting, spending, saving and giving.

Find ways to help others. Discuss what it means to be responsible. Help your child find meaningful ways to contribute to her family and to the community, such as doing household chores and donating clothes to charity.

Adjust rules and responsibilities. As your child matures, their abilities will change. Perhaps she can take on more grown-up chores. Or maybe she can make new, exciting decisions. Talk about how great it feels to be responsible.

Regular Board Meeting

April 11, 2016

The regular meeting of the Maquoketa Valley Board of Education was called to order by President John Zietlow at 6:00 p.m. in the Middle School Conference Room in Delhi, Iowa. All motions carried unanimously unless otherwise noted. Five board members were present. There were four staff and one visitor present. The agenda and the consent items were approved.

At 6:02 p.m., President John Zietlow declared this to be the time and place to hold the hearing on the proposed budget for the 2016-2017 school year. The proposed tax rate is \$14.69258. The documents were reviewed and there being no comments, the Board President declared the hearing closed. The motion passed to approve the budget estimate as published. A roll call vote was answered all ayes.

Prior to the book fair held in Delhi during conference in March, Audrey Moenck organized a "Coin War" in grades JK-8. The students were able to raise \$1839.52. This money was used to purchase books for the Delhi library.

Our students scored well on the lowa Assessments this year. Generally, 80% or more of students being proficient is considered a sign of healthy core instruction. We met this target at every grade level in every area, with 100% proficiency in 3rd grade math and 4th grade science.

The Board approved the low bid from Boland Recreation in the amount of \$80,000 to replace the playground equipment at Delhi Elementary. The equipment will be replaced over the summer.

The Board approved the 2016-2017 membership dues to Iowa Association of School Boards in the amount of \$2,514.

The Board approved the call to request for natural gas proposals.

One open enrollment request in was approved.

The following personnel recommendations were approved:

Jason Helle – resignation from Middle School Boys Basketball Coach (Contingent upon finding a suitable replacement. This is a correction from last month. Mr. Helle will not be resigning from MS Girls Basketball.)

Diane Temple – resignation from Assistant Individual Speech Coach (Contingent upon finding a suitable replacement.)

The Board approved Maquoketa Valley's participation in the 2016-2017 Jones Regional Alternative Program.


The Board approved the proposed grade realignment proposal that was approved by the majority of the PK-3rd grade parents.

Supt. Tuetken asked the Board to begin thinking of potential nominees for the Five Star Award in recognition to an organization or individual who has gone "above and beyond" in their support for our school district. The award will be given at the graduation ceremonies held on May 18th.

The May board meeting will be held at Johnston Elementary.

The Academic Excellence and National Honor ceremonies will be held on May 4th at 6:30 p.m. in the High School commons. Baccalaureate is scheduled for May 15th at 1:30 in the High School Auditorium and the Senior Award Ceremony will begin at 3:00 in the Middle School gym.

The meeting adjourned at 6:59 p.m.



5th Grade Student Earns an Award

Anna Deutmeyer, a fifth grade student at Maquoketa Valley, was recently awarded a certificate by Loras Mensen for her first place flag essay. Loras is the Commander for the Earlville Legion, Post 436.

Fifth grade students wrote essays for the American Legion in Earlville in November about what the flag means to them. Anna received 1st place in the local competition. Her essay was sent to the district level where she won 1st place for NE Iowa District #4. Her essay was then sent to the State level where she won 1st place!



There were around 3000 essays statewide submitted in November. This is the first time the Earlville Legion has ever had a student receive first place at the District level and State level.

Anna and her family have been invited to the Legion's State Convention in Coralville in mid-July. Anna will read her essay at the convention.

Earlville Kindergarten

I love teaching Kindergarten for multiple reasons but the biggest reason is the huge amount of growth that all the students make every year. Most students enter Kindergarten knowing their upper case letters and some letter sounds. By this point in the year they are reading easy leveled reader books and writing sentences! Currently, the students are working on writing an opinion paper. We read a story together as a class and then the students write what their favorite part of the story was. They have learned that you have to have reasons to support your opinion. We are also working on making sure we are writing complete sentences with a capital at the beginning, a period, and spaces between the words. The students are also expected to use their sounds to spell unknown words.

In math the students have finished their unit on addition and subtraction. We are now working with numbers. We have learned about numbers 11-20 and are now working on 20-100. The students have an understanding of greater than, less than, and ways to make ten. They can count by ones and tens to 100.

Science has also been a lot of fun this year with our new science kits. We currently have a variety of "pets" in our classroom including goldfish, guppies, snails and worms! The students are learning what the different animals need to survive and how they compare to each other. We have also done a unit on trees this year. We have observed trees in each season and how they change throughout the year. We have also discussed the importance of trees.

Third Grade News

It's been a productive year for our third grade Wildcats. Multiplication, division, and understanding fractions were three major standards to master. The students have filled their "math toolboxes" with numerous strategies to help them multiply and divide, and use those skills to determine the perimeter and area of different shapes.

"Reading to learn" has been our literacy focus, so we've integrated science and social studies topics in with our reading series. Students analyzed historical events to better understand cause and effect. They researched famous women in history in order to infer their character traits and evaluate their influence on society. Our new Earth and Life Science kits include access to e-books, which have taught us how to use sidebars and hyperlinks to further our comprehension.

These tech savvy students have enjoyed using the iPads to create trading cards over famous people and mini posters to showcase their research using Pic Collage. Mrs. Scherrman, our Technology Coach, taught us how to use Google Docs for our writing projects as well as creating a Google presentation. The students have a great deal to feel proud of as they reflect on their achievements over the past school year!

NOTE: This open house is an opportunity to tour any of the elementary buildings in the district. If you have never been to one of our

elementary centers, we hope you take this opportunity to visit the school, see the classrooms, and familiarize yourself with the center your child may be attending in the future. In the fall, classrooms will look quite different after teachers have moved into their newly assigned rooms. Johnston Elementary will change the most as new carpet, countertops and sinks will be installed over the summer as part of routinely scheduled maintenance. During the August Backto-School Night, students will have the opportunity to see their classrooms, meet their teachers, and drop off their school supplies.

Maquoketa Valley Middle School Science: Change is Good!

This last August the Iowa Board of Education voted to adopt new state science standards based on the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS). This meant a major shift in what was to be taught at the middle school level. Fortunately, we have been preparing for this!



My first year of teaching science, I switched from using the Iowa Core to the NGSS to guide what is taught in my classroom. The



NGSS offered more rigorous learning and embedded real scientific practices as well as cross-curricular concepts like math, engineering, writing and literacy. It was a way to challenge our students and provide preparation for real life. By using them, I have

become knowledgeable with what students have been taught coming into 7th grade, what they need to learn in 7th and 8th

grade, and what they will need to know to set them up for success in their high school classes.

In April, with the adoption of NGSS sure to pass, we made the decision to move from teaching just one general science concept a year to teaching aspects from all three general science concepts a year. Each year of middle school will cover life, earth, and physical science. We will do this in a two-year cycle,



covering everything from genetics, to our solar system, to weather, to energy. We have also picked up four new Foss Kit modules that are prepackaged with interesting and applicable hands-on experiments that are already aligned to the new standards.



This transition year has been productive and exciting! With a deadline of two years to enact the NGSS, Maquoketa Valley Science is well ahead of it and blazing a trail of success. Students have been exploring planetary science,

heredity, evolution, earth history, and force and motion. Next year they can look forward to organism populations and ecosystems, weather and water cycles, and waves and energy.

We will continue to build our students' strong science learning and encourage our student scientists to grow in curiosity, professional practices, and advanced technological uses. The opportunities for our students grow with each change because they better prepare them for the challenges of our world today. Maquoketa Valley students are set to tackle the challenges of tomorrow.
