Regular Board Meeting

April 17, 2017

The regular meeting of the Maquoketa Valley Board of Education was called to order by President John Zietlow at 5:30 p.m. in the Middle School Conference Room in Delhi, Iowa. All motions carried unanimously unless otherwise noted. Four board members were present. There were six staff members and ten visitors present. The agenda and consent items were approved.

On Tuesday, April 5th, the District Wellness Committee met to review and make possible changes to the District Wellness Policy. The committee revised the policy to state that beginning with the 2017-2018 school year, chocolate milk will not be served for breakfast. No other changes were made to the policy for the 2017-2018 school year.

The Board approved and placed on file the Tax Exemption Certificate for the proposed issuance of \$4,000,000 School Infrastructure Sales, Service and Use Tax Revenue Bonds, Series 2017. A roll call vote was answered all ayes.

The Board approved the following resolution:

"RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND PROVIDING FOR THE TERMS OF ISSUANCE AND SECURING THE PAYMENT OF \$4,000,000 SCHOOL INFRASTRUCTURE SALES, SERVICE AND USE TAX

REVENUE BONDS, SERIES 2017, OF THE MAQUOKETA VALLEY COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT, STATE OF IOWA, UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF CHAPTERS 423E AND 423F OF THE CODE OF IOWA, AND PROVIDING FOR A METHOD OF PAYMENT OF SAID BONDS."

A roll call vote was answered all ayes.

The Board approved the A-1 Storage contract for the renal of storage containers.

The Board also approved the 2017-2018 membership dues to Iowa Association of School Board in the amount of \$2,645.00.

The Board approved a bid in the amount of \$86,529 from Hoglund Bus for the purchase of a 65-passenger school bus which will be delivered after July 1st. SAVE dollars will be used to purchase this bus.

At 6:10 p.m. in a motion by Dabroski, seconded by Huber the Board entered into a closed session pursuant to Chapter 21.9 of the Code of Iowa for the purpose of discussing strategy in matters relating to employment conditions of employees of the school who are not covered by the collective bargaining agreement. A roll call vote was answered all ayes. At 6:39 p.m. the Board entered into open session.

The following salary adjustments were approved:

Classified Staff: average salary increase of

2.25% plus step movement

Superintendent: Shared contract with Midland which includes transportation. This will be a 50/50 split of all salary and benefits with Midland. This is a one-year contract. Maquoketa Valley's salary portion will be \$82,500. Maquoketa Valley's base contract will be a three-year rollover contract.

School Improvement Director, Elementary Principal, Delhi/Middle School Principal, Dean of Students: \$7,636 total package which is an average 2% salary increase per position

Business Manager: \$2,000 salary increase (sharing agreement)

High School Principal: \$83,000/year with a 220-day contract

The board also approved two-year Administrative contracts for the 2017-2018 school year.

The meeting adjourned at 6:41 p.m.

Special Board Meeting

April 10, 2017

A special meeting of the Maquoketa Valley Board of Education was called to order by Vice President Mike Feldmann at 5:15 p.m. in the Middle School Conference Room in Delhi, Iowa. All motions carried unanimously unless otherwise noted. Three board members were present. There were two staff members present. The agenda was approved.

At 5:16 p.m., Vice President Mike Feldmann declared this to be the time and place to hold the hearing on the proposed budget for the 2017-2018 school year. The proposed tax rate is \$10.62406. The documents were reviewed and there being no comments, the Board Vice President declared the hearing closed. The motion passed to approve the budget estimate as published. A roll call vote was answered all ayes.

One open enrollment request in was approved.

The Board approved the bond counsel engagement agreement from Ahlers and Cooney, P.C. of the proposed issuance of approximately \$4,000,000 School Infrastructure Sales, Service and Use Tax Revenue Bonds, Series 2017.

The following personnel recommendations were approved:

Travis Ford – employed as Instrumental Music Teacher

Troy Osterhaus – employed as 9-12 HS Principal

The Board also approved Maquoketa Valley Community School's participation in the Jones Regional Alternative Program for the 2017-2018 school year.

The Foundation for the Future of Delaware County Grant

Maquoketa Valley has received a grant from The Foundation for the Future of Delaware County to create Makerspace Labs in Earlville Elementary, Johnston Elementary, Delhi Elementary, and Maquoketa Valley Middle School. Within these labs would be age appropriate materials and technologies for students to research, build, create, tinker, and most importantly share ideas, successes, and failure. Through Makerspaces, students can take ownership of their learning and incorporate technologies that will allow them to show original thinking and become problem solvers. The Foundation for the Future of Delaware County has graciously chosen Maquoketa Valley as a recipient, and without this grant, our students wouldn't be able to have access to these new materials and technologies, so we truly appreciate this opportunity.

Here's what the grant will allow us to purchase:

In Earlville Elementary which is our early childhood center housing 4 year old Preschool, Junior Kindergarten, and Kindergarten will be simpler technologies and materials such as Legos, K'Nex, and Stop Motion Video Animation Sets that would work the iPads that are already used in the classroom.

At Johnston Elementary where all of our first and second graders attend, much of the same materials and technologies are age appropriate, but a few additions will be beneficial. K'Nex makes a "Discover Controls" kit that will allow students to learn and build using small motors, buzzers and LEDs that is listed to fit best with grades 1-3. Also, we are adding the Snap Circuits set where students could learn about electronics such as doorbells, FM Radio technology, and more.

At Delhi Elementary where our third, fourth, and fifth grade students attend, as well as Maquoketa Valley Middle school where our sixth, seventh, and eighth graders attend will contain much of the same materials as the lower elementaries with a few adjustments. The K'Nex kit that best fits this age group instead of the "Discover Controls" kit is the "K'Nex Energy, Motion, and Aeronautics Kit." While using this kit, students will explore concepts about force and motion and people who work and live in space. Another addition will be a Little Bits STEAM Student Set. Little Bits are easy-to-use magnetized electronic building blocks where students would be able to create endless things using electronics such as a light switch or motorized car. Lastly, Google Cardboard which is a virtual reality tool will be added to the Delhi campus.

Next spring the committee will analyze if further steps need to be taken to reduce the consumption of chocolate milk by our early childhood and elementary children." Next school year, 2017-18, the change will look like this: Only white milk will be available at breakfast time, everyday. Chocolate milk will continue to be served at lunch, everyday. These guidelines will be for our PS-8th grade students. Cheese, at snack time, will continue without changes.

I just want to say **THANK YOU** to all of the wonderful parents and staff members that have helped me through my first year as the elementary and middle school counselor at Maquoketa Valley! The class meeting provides students with many opportunities to practice the skills of greeting, listening and responding, and group-problem solving. To be successful with academics students also need to learn social and emotional skills such as cooperation, assertiveness, responsibility, empathy, and self-control. Class meetings are a wonderful and fun tool for teachers to build upon students social and emotional skill set!




SENIOR AWARDS
