Each and every year, the beginning of a new school year brings new enthusiasm to our students and staff. It also seems to always coincide with a number of changes throughout our district. Obviously this year is no exception! First and foremost, we have had some changes in our personnel. With the retirements of Pam Overman, Kevin Kudrna and Wilma Jesenovec this has driven a number of our changes. With the departure of Pam, Brandy Whittenbaugh has moved over to the high school office. Cheryl Gates returned back to the middle school office after being in the high school office this past year. Sarah Lown, moved from the classroom to replace Cheryl at the high school. Both Brandy and Sarah will support Erika Imler who has been moved to Kevin's office in the high school. Rachel Bonert moved to Sarah's 5th grade position. Trevor Arnold was hired to replace Kevin as one of our PE instructors and will also take over the Activity Director Duties. Trevor will also be our new Head Football Coach and weight training coach. Trevor's wife Rachel will be one of our new special education associates at Johnston. Taryn Fellinger has been hired as one of our second grade teachers at Johnston with the departure of Sarah Cherne to Guttenburg. Heidi Hoeger had been doing a number of long term substitutes in the district. She will now be a 3rd grade instructor. With a 1st grade opening at Johnston, Jessica Dusek, who was our preschool instructor transferred into that position and Brittini Ludovissy was hired to replace Jessica. With a huge influx of junior kindergarten students, Margo Friedlein has been hired as a second JK teacher at Earlville. Tiersa Frasher transferred into our new 3rd-8th Behavioral Intervention position and Brianna Pfeiler was hired to replace Tiersa. Samantha Kruse also transferred from the classroom into a full time special education position within the district and Jackie Moorman will move into that 6th grade position. With the loss of Marty Tumey, who will be dearly missed, Mark Smith has been hired to drive Marty's route. Joe Hoeger also returns to one of our bus routes this fall. If you have the opportunity to see one of the new members to our district, please welcome them to our school community.

In regards to facility updates, we have almost completely finish the remodel and renovation of the High School. This summer the blacktop parking area will be ground down and couple of inches of new blacktop will be poured, painted and sealed. A small portion of the cement pad located in front of the high school entrance will also be replaced due to a defect in the recent replacement. Some minor tuckpointing and soffit repair will also occur.

At the time of this writing we have begun creating a double-door locking vestibule for our middle school and elementary in Delhi. This includes new interior entrance doors and a new entrance into the Middle School and Delhi Elementary office. At Earlville, new carpet has been installed in the hallways and office areas and work on a new gym roof has begun. At Johnston some minor roof repair and upkeep will also be completed in August. The usual dusting, carpet cleaning, scrubbing, mopping waxing, painting and ventilation filter replacement continues throughout the district. With the arrival of the ash borer to Delaware County, as painful as it is, we have begun a process to removing our ash trees from our campuses. We will strategically replant trees later this fall and next spring.

All of us are extremely excited about the 2019 – 2020 school year. With all of our building projects, our new teachers and support staff that will be joining our MV family, I know it will be a fantastic year! Using RevTrak to Pay Online Fees

- 1)Go to www.maquoketa-v.k12.ia.us
- 2)Select RevTrak link
- 3)On the top of the page, select Login. You will be then creating a new account. You must have an account to p fees and place money in lunch accounts.
- 4) You will place your own information in the first section of creating an account, then select at the bottom CREATE
- 5)You will then be directed to list your Children's full names, grade level, and student ID. This is listed at the bottom of the page. You will also need to put in a valid credit card/debit card. The credit card may be a Discover, MasterCard, or Visa issued credit or debit card.
- 6)To make a payment or purchase items,
 - Click a category button on the homepage or select a group from the "Browse" menu on the left side of the screen. Select the item you wish to purchase, enter any requested information, and click the Add To Shopping Cart button.
 - Click the Go to Checkout button to proceed to checkout or the Continue Shopping button to add additions items to your cart.
 - At the checkout screen, if this is your first purchase in the Web Store, enter a valid email address and click
 the Continue button. This email address will serve as your Web Store account login on subsequent visits. If
 you are a returning customer, enter the email address and password you established on your first visit and
 click the Sign in button.
 - Complete billing and account information, if applicable.
 - Verify information and click the Complete Order button. Your order will be processed, and you may then view and print your receipt, if desired.

7)The final step of your checkout process produces a printable receipt. In addition, a confirmation email is sent immediately to the email address you provided during checkout. If you do not receive the confirmation email, check your SPAM filter as it may have been filtered by your email client. In addition, any time after you complete your purchase, you may click the My Account button from the menu on the left and login using the email address you provided. From there, you can check your purchase history to verify that your order was correctly placed.

Registration and 2019-20 School Fees

Registration of students and payment of fees will be Tuesday, August 12 from 11:00 AM until 3:00 PM.
Registration is for one day in DELHI only in the High School Cafeteria, although parents are strongly encouraged to register from home (starting Aug. 7) by going into the MV school website and use the PowerSchool link located there. Information about PowerSchool and how to register, including your login user name and password, has been mailed to you. If you do not have the school letter by Thursday, Aug. 1st, please contact Sarah Lown at 563-922-2091 or sarahlown@maguoketa-v.k12.ia.us.

Opening day of school will be Friday, August 23, 2019. The school day starts at 8:00 AM and ends at 3:20 PM. Early outs will be at 1:05 PM. (Please see school calendar in this newsletter or on line.)

As in the past, through the PowerSchool link, parents are asked to update information at home for all children enrolled in school. It is especially important for parents to update e-mail addresses, since notices of early dismissals, make-up information, etc. are now being sent that way. Also, cell phone numbers need to be updated for text alerts. Many forms are located on the school website (www.maquoketa-v.k12.ia.us) including this August newsletter, Free/Reduced Form, Physical Form and many more.

When parents register from home, it is best to also use the MV online payment program RevTrak. (See instructions on previous page of this newsletter.) With this program, you will be able to pay your 2019-20 school year fees and submit lunch money using your same PowerSchool login username and password. Fees incurred paying online will be waived Wednesday, August 7th through Fri., August 16th.

For those families who apply for Free or Reduced meals: the form has been mailed to you in the same envelope as your PowerSchool information. Starting this year, it is best to complete the form and mail it to MV school by Aug. 12th. If you need help, please come to the high school office prior to August 12th and see Brandy Whittenbaugh. Also, families new to MV, please come to school for registration and bring the social security cards and birth certificates of your child or children with you.

Again this school year, the cost of the MV Assignment Notebook has been included in the student materials fees and will no longer be a separate charge. Your child's assignment notebook will be in his/her classroom on Back-to-School Night.

If you choose the waiver, sign and date the Waiver Statement which is located at the bottom of the second page of the Free or Reduced meals application. Also, on the application, you can check on children's health insurance offered by the State of Iowa called hawk-i.

Note to Parents

As the summer winds down and we get ready for the 2019-20 school year, there are a few health items you need to make sure are completed. Students entering the following grades will need to have:

Preschool: A physical and current immunizations

JK/K: A physical, current immunizations, dental screening and vision screening (the "KidSight" program (that comes to school) will qualify)

7th grade: Current immunizations including the Tdap and Meningitis vaccine

9th grade: Dental Screening (your dentist should have the form or you can e-mail me)

12th grade: Current immunizations including the Meningitis vaccine (one dose after age 16 or two doses if the first was given before age 16)

Regular Board Meeting

June 20, 2019

The regular meeting of the Maquoketa Valley Board of Education was called to order by President John Zietlow at 5:30 p.m. in the High School Conference Room in Delhi, Iowa. All motions carried unanimously unless otherwise noted. Four board members were present. There were two staff present and one visitor. The agenda and consent items were approved.

Board secretary, Erika Imler, was authorized to pay bills owed yet this fiscal year prior to June 30th.

The Board approved the 2019-2020 Managed Service Contract from Infrastructure Technology Solutions. The Board also approved the Middle School Football sharing agreement with Edgewood-Colesburg Community School District for the 2019 season.

Student fees and prices for the 2019-2020 school year were reviewed. A 15-cent increase was approved for all food service prices. All other fees will remain the same for the 2019-2020 school year. The following food service and student fees were set for the 2019-2020 school year:

The Board approved the natural gas bid from Encore Energy for the 2019-2020 school year.

Supt. Tuetken shared meeting minutes from the Wellness Committee meeting that was held in April.

Supt. Tuetken also highlighted some main points of interest from the 2019 legislative session.

The Board reviewed the IASB Legislative Action Priorities and will begin the process of choosing the District's top five priorities for 2019-2020.

Supt. Tuetken took a few minutes to discuss the board goal setting process and presented the Director's with information on previous Board goals and Superintendent goals. Further discussion on this process will take place at the July meeting.

The Board will begin the process of transferring the Hazel and Albert Parcels to the City of Earlville. This process will begin in July after a formal legal description is secured.

The July board meeting will be held on July 22nd at 5:30 p.m.

At 6:01 p.m. in a motion by Feldmann, seconded by Huber the Board entered into a closed session pursuant Section 21.5 (g) of the Code of Iowa to avoid disclosure of special law enforcement matters which if disclosed would enable law violators to avoid detection. A roll call vote was answered as follows: Feldmann, Huber, Kunde, Zietlow; all ayes. Carried.

At 6:16 p.m. the Board entered into open session.

The Board approved the District and Building Emergency Operation Plan.

The meeting adjourned at 6:17 p.m.


"I am so excited about going to school on Wednesday's because I know that I get to see my mentor and we get to do fun things together!" Andrew, 8 years old

IOWA ATHLETIC PRE-PARTICIPATION PHYSICAL EXAMINATION

ARTICLE VII 36.14(1) PHYSICAL EXAMINATION. Every year each student (grades 7-12) shall present to the student's superintendent a certificate signed by a licensed physician and surgeon, osteopathic physician and surgeon, osteopath, advanced registered nurse practitioner (ARNP), physician's assistant or qualified doctor of chiropractic, to the effect that the student has been examined and may safely engage in athletic competition. This certificate of physical examination is valid for the purposes of this rule for one (1) calendar year. A grace period, not to exceed thirty (30) days, is allowed for expired certifications of physical examination.
