Welcome Back By Superintendent Dave Hoeger

Dear Parents, Staff, and Community Members. Welcome to the 2020-2021 school year at Maquoketa Valley. We ended the last school year in a very unusual way and this fall looks like it is going to be interesting as well. I am very honored to be your Superintendent of the Maquoketa Valley and North Linn School Districts. Maquoketa Valley is doing amazing work and I plan to spend time learning about the district by meeting and talking to staff and community members. I am excited to work with others to continue to build upon the great things that are taking place for our students. I would like to share a little about myself. I grew up in Dyersville and attended Western Dubuque High School. After college, I taught 9 years in Dubuque and then took a math position at Western Dubuque in 1998. I taught for 6 more years and then became an administrator at WD for 12 years before becoming a Superintendent in Montezuma. I was there for 3 years before moving back to the area to be your Superintendent at Maquoketa Valley. My wife, Jane and I have 3 adult children. My 2 daughters live in San Diego and my son lives in Scottsdale, Arizona. We do not yet have any grandchildren but hope that changes soon. The kids all live in great areas but Jane and I hope they make their way back to the midwest so we can see them more often.

As I mentioned above, this promises to be a very interesting fall for school districts across Iowa and the nation. Our goal at Maquoketa Valley is to have the students and staff in the building every day because we believe that gives up the best opportunity to educate our students. Due to the COVID virus, that may or may not be a reality. We continue to have conversations with our county and state health officials, the Department of Education, and our Area Education Agency to discuss how to safely educate our students. With information constantly changing we want to wait as long as possible before finalizing our plan for the fall. We will be sharing additional information with you as soon as possible.

My motivation comes from trying to continually improve our schools to provide as many opportunities as possible and meeting the needs of all of our students. There is very strong community support for our school and that is tremendously important. My goal is to learn as much as possible about the district and then find ways to constantly improve. I am very excited to be the superintendent of both Maquoketa Valley and North Linn and I am motivated to stay in this position for many years. I look forward to meeting staff and community members so please stop and introduce yourself.

Finally, I would like to thank Doug Tuetken for his many years of service at MV. He has been an important part of the success of this school district and has been very helpful to me during my transition into this role. I wish Doug all the best in his retirement.

Using Revtrak to Pay Online Fees

- 1.Go to www.maquoketa-v.k12.ia.us
- 2.Select RevTrak link
- 3.On the top of the page, select Login. You will be then creating a new account. You must have an account to place fees and place money in lunch accounts
- 4. You will place your own information in the first section of creating an account, then select at the bottom CREATE
- 5. You will then be directed to list your children's full names, grade level, ad student ID. This is listed at the bottom if the page. You will also need to put in a valid credit card/debit card. The credit card may be a Discover, MasterCard, or Visa issued credit or debit card.
- 6.To make a payment or purchase items,
- a.Click a category button on the homepage or select a group from the "browse" menu on the left side of the screen. Select the item you wish to purchase, enter any requested information, and click the add to shopping cart button.
- b.Click the Go to Checkout button to proceed to checkout or the Continue Shopping button and add additional items to your cart.
- c.At the checkout screen, if this is your first purchase in the Web Store, enter a valid email address and click the continue button. This email address will serve as your Web Store account login on subsequent visits. If you are a returning customer, enter the email address and password you established on your first visit and click the sign in button.
- d.Complete billing and account information, if applicable
- e. Verify information and click the complete order button. Your order will be processed, and you may then view and print your receipt, if desired.
- 7. The final step of your checkout process produces a printable receipt. In addition, a confirmation email is sent immediately to the email address you provide during checkout. If you do not receive the confirmation email, check your SPAM filter as it may have been filtered by your email client. In addition, any time after you complete your purchase, you may click the my account button from the menu on the left and login using the email address you provided. From there, you can check your purchase history to verify that your order was correctly placed.

Registration of students and payment of fees must be completed online beginning on Wednesday, July 22nd. If you are unable to complete this process online, please call the high school office (563.922.2091) to set up an appointment. We are asking that there are no walk-ins at this time for registration assistance unless an appointment has been made prior to arriving. Instructions for registering current MV students and/or new to the district and paying fees will be mailed to you. If you do not receive this information by August 1st, please contact Sarah Lown at 563.922.2091 or at sarahlown@maguoketa-v.k12.ia.us.

For those families who apply for free/reduced meals, the form will be mailed to you with the other registration information. As a reminder, the forms for applying need to be turned into Morgan Manternach in the middle school office PRIOR to paying. Applying does not necessarily mean acceptance.

The first day of school is Wednesday, August 12th. The school day will start at 8:00am and conclude at 1:05pm from August 12th to August 21st due to teacher professional development. Beginning on August 24th, the school day will then conclude at 3: 20pm. Please refer to the school calendar online for more information.

As in the past, through the PowerSchool link, parents are asked to update information at home for all children enrolled at school. It is especially important for parents to update email addresses and phone numbers as notices of early dismissals, make-up information, etc. are communicated electronically. Text alerts will be sent from the high school office number (562.922.2091) while emails will be sent from mvalerts@maquoketa-v.k12.ia.us. If phone numbers and emails are incorrect in PowerSchool, you will not receive these messages.

Regular Board Meeting

June 15, 2020

The regular meeting of the Maquoketa Valley Board of Education was called to order by President Donna Kunde at 5:30 p.m. in the High School Library in Delhi, Iowa. All motions carried unanimously unless otherwise noted. Four board members were present. There were seven staff present and one visitor. The agenda and consent items were approved.

Athletic Director, Trevor Arnold, gave the Board an update on the softball and baseball program and the safety precautions the teams are taking for the summer. Mr. Arnold also updated the Board on open gym procedures. Decisions for weight room and other school activities will be made on July 1st.

Brenda Becker and Tiersa Frasher updated the Board on the Return to Learn Plan which will be submitted to the state by July 1st. In the fall, the District will be one-on-one in regards to technology. Students in grades JK-2 will be sing Chromebooks and students in grades 3-12 will be using MacBook's. The District was able to secure a grant from Delaware County with the help of Donna Boss in the amount of \$32,876.39 to purchase the additional technology. The District also received a donation in the amount of \$990 from Earlville United Parish for some elementary technology needs. The Board expressed their appreciation to both Delaware County and Earlville United Parish for the continued support of Maguoketa Valley.

Board secretary, Erika Imler, was authorized to pay bills owed yet this fiscal year prior to June 30th.

Three open enrollment out requests were approved and three open enrollment requests in were approved.

The Board approved the 2020-2021 Managed Service Contract from Infrastructure Technology Solutions.

The 2020-2021 Faculty, Staff and Parent Handbooks were approved.

The Board approved an increase in the substitute teacher pay rate from \$110 per day to \$125 per day.

The Board approved the 2020-2021 Life Connections School-Based Health Services Contract.

As the summer winds down and we get ready for the 2020-21 school year, there are a few health items you need to make sure are completed. Students entering the following grades will need to have:

Preschool: A physical and current immunizations

JK/K: A physical, current immunizations, dental screening and vision screening (the "KidSight" program (that comes to school) will qualify)

7th grade: Current immunizations including the Tdap and Meningitis vaccine (Must be completed before school starts)

9th grade: Dental Screening (your dentist should have the form or you can e-mail me)

12th grade: Current immunizations including the Meningitis vaccine (one dose after age 16 or two doses if the first was given before age 16) (must be completed before school starts)

This certificate of physical examination is valid for the purposes this rule for one (1) calendar year. A grace period, not to exceed thirty (30) days, is allowed for expired certifications of physical examination.
