SCHOOL BOARD MINUTES

Regular Board Meeting

April 12, 2021

A special meeting of the Maquoketa Valley Board of Education was called to order by Donna Kunde at 5:30 p.m. in the High School Library in Delhi, Iowa and via Zoom. All motions carried unanimously unless otherwise noted. Five board members were present. There were two staff present. The agenda was approved.

At 5:31 p.m., President Donna Kunde declared this to be the time and place to hold the hearing on the proposed budget for the 2021-2022 school year. The proposed tax rate is \$9.98653. This is a decrease of \$0.12 from fiscal year 2021. The documents were reviewed and there being no comments, the Board President declared the hearing closed. Motion by Zietlow, seconded by Dabroski to approve the budget estimate as presented. A roll call vote was answered as follows: Dabroski, Feldmann, Huber, Kunde, Zietlow; all ayes. Carried.

One open enrollment request in and four open enrollment requests out were approved. All ayes. Carried.

The following personnel recommendations were approved:

- Natalie Murphy – employed as Special Education Teacher
- Randy Turner – resignation as High School Baseball Coach
- Chris Bawek – resignation as Middle School Paraprofessional
- Meredith Robinson – resignation as Middle School Paraprofessional

The Board approved an additional five contract days for the High School Vocational Educational Teacher, Haylee Lau for the 2020-2021 school year.

The Board approved the bid from Hoglund Bus for a wheelchair lift bus in the amount of \$55,000. The District will use SAVE funds to pay for the purchase of this bus.

The Board approved the list of the 2021 seniors for graduation at Maquoketa Valley Community High School as long as all graduation requirements have been met.

The Board approved the driver's education contract with RightWay Driver Education, Inc. The Board also approved the 2021-2022 AEA Cooperative Purchasing Agreement.

The Board approved the Iowa Local Government Risk Pool Commission Natural Gas Program Participation Agreement for the 2021-2022 school year. This agreement allows Maquoketa Valley Community School District to participate in a joint agreement establishing local government risk pool for natural gas prices.

At 5:48 p.m., President Donna Kunde declared this the time and place to hold a public hearing on the proposed 2021-2022 school calendar. The documents were reviewed and there being no comments, the Board President declared the hearing closed. The Board approved the 2021-2022 school calendar as presented.

The Board was presented with information regarding the 2021-2022 collective bargaining settlement and approved the 2021-2022 collective bargaining settlement which equated to a 3.50% increase.

Mary Ries was awarded a Foundation for the Future of Delaware County Grant in the amount of \$1200. This grant will be used to purchase personal care supplies and winter attire for students. Additionally, in March the K-12 School Counselor team, Ms. Hansen from Life Connections and Mrs. Frasher collaborated on a Mental Health and Disability Service Grant to receive funding from the Coronavirus Relief Fund under the CARES Act. The District was awarded this grant in the amount of \$7,211.24 to purchase SEL resources, books and materials to support students and teachers with social emotional learning needs.

At 5:54 p.m. in a motion by Feldmann, seconded by Huber the Board entered into a closed session pursuant to Chapter 21.9 of the Iowa Code for the purpose of discussing strategy in matters relating to employment conditions of employees of the school who are not covered by the collective bargaining agreement. A roll call vote was answered as follows: Dabroski, Feldmann, Huber, Kunde, Zietlow; all ayes. Carried.

At 6:22 p.m. the Board entered into open session.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:23 p.m.

Regular Board Meeting

April 19, 2021

The regular meeting of the Maquoketa Valley Board of Education was called to order by President Donna Kunde at 5:30 p.m. in the High Library in Delhi, Iowa. All motions carried unanimously unless otherwise noted. Five board members were present. There were eight staff and fourteen visitors present. The agenda and consent items were approved.

Keith Kramer, from the Maquoketa Valley chapter of Dollars for Scholars, presented the Board with information regarding the financial position of Dollars for Scholars.

The following personnel recommendations were approved:

- John Grimm – employed as Assistant HS Baseball Coach
- Norman Wilson – employed as Assistant HS Baseball Coach
- Norman Wilson – employed as MS Baseball Coach

- Jessica Dusek – resignation as 1st Grade Teacher

Luke Livingston addressed the Board regarding the mask mandate implemented by the District. After further discussion the Board voted and approved to continue the use of masks for the remaining of the 2020-2021 school year with further evaluation of this during the summer.

The Board approved the request to allow North Cedar join the Tri-Rivers Conference beginning with the 2022-2023 school year.

At 6:23 p.m., President Donna Kunde declared this to be the time and place to hold the hearing the Transfer of School Property Parcel #490-03-096-20 to Lonnie L. Sternhagen. Parcel #490-03-096-20 known as part of the formal road locally known as Park Road in the Subdivision of the North Half (N ½) of the Northeast Quarter (NE ¼) of Section Twenty (20), Township Eighty-eight (88) North, Range Four (4) West of the Fifth P.M., according to Plat of Survey recorded in Book L. D. 3 Page 258 – 259, lying South of Lot 24 of said Subdivision and North of the South Quarter line of the Northeast Quarter (NE ¼) of the Northeast Quarter (NE ¼), and West of the West Right of Way line of Peters Dr., except the West 132 feet thereof. There were no comments and the Board President called the hearing closed.

In a motion by Dabrowski, seconded by Feldmann the Board adopted the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Board deems it necessary and desirable to dispose of the real estate, a land-locked parcel, Delaware County, Iowa Parcel #490-00-03-096-20 ("Property") and legally described as:

That part of the formal road locally known as Park Road in the Subdivision of the North Half (N ½) of the Northeast Quarter (NE ¼) of Section Twenty (20), Township Eighty-eight (88) North, Range Four (4) West of the Fifth P.M., according to Plat of Survey recorded in Book L. D. 3 Page 258 – 259, lying South of Lot 24 of said Subdivision and North of the South Quarter line of the Northeast Quarter (NE ¼) of the Northeast Quarter (NE ¼), and West of the West Right of Way line of Peters Dr., except the West 132 feet thereof

WHEREAS, the Board has previously set forth its proposal specifying its intent to convey the Property to Lonnie L. Sternhagen.;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Directors of the Maquoketa Valley Community School District, State of Iowa, as follows:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the President of the Board of Directors is authorized to execute a warranty deed and the necessary documentation to complete this transaction.

The Board approved the call for a bus bid to be purchased in FY22 with SAVE funds.

At 6:45 p.m. in a motion by Feldmann, seconded by Huber the Board entered into a closed session pursuant to Chapter 21.9 of the Iowa Code for the purpose of discussing strategy in matters relating to employment conditions of employees of the school who are not covered by the collective bargaining agreement. A roll call vote was answered as follows: Dabrowski, Feldmann, Huber, Kunde, Zietlow; all ayes. Carried.

At 7:02 p.m. the Board entered into open session.

The Board approved the following salary adjustments for the 2021-2022 school year:

- Administrative Staff – 3.49% TP increase
- Classified Staff – 2.5% increase plus step movement

The meeting was adjourned at 7:04 p.m.
