# NICC AND MAQUOKETA VALLEY HIGH SCHOOL CAREER EXPLORATION FAIR

DELHI—Maquoketa Valley High School is addressing career exploration head on with a new career unit established by English teachers Debbie Devore and Audrey Moenck.

With Holly Maurer, director of the UIU/NICC MREP Center, and Poppy Conlon, High School Partnership Career Specialist at Northeast Iowa Community College (NICC), Devore and Moenck developed career exploration activities for Maquoketa Valley juniors. The goals of the career unit are to encourage the juniors' engagement in career exploration by learning about different career pathways, career preparedness and workplace communication. The students will now draw upon their experiences by creating an ePortfolio through Google Site where they will collect and reflect on their different career experiences throughout their junior school year.

Maurer and Conlon met with the juniors on Friday, Sept. 16, to discuss preparedness for an interview, professional dress, an appropriate handshake and appropriate email addresses and voicemail messages. The students then applied these skills in a follow-up meeting with area professionals at a career event held at Maquoketa Valley on Monday, Oct 3.

Thirteen business professionals volunteered their time to meet with the 54 high school juniors in a speed dating style career event. The students met with six professionals of their choosing to learn more about different career pathways. The professionals included a photographer, nurse, dietician, physical therapy assistant, executive director, director of human resources, certified public accountant, farmer, deputy, national guard reservist, automotive manager/estimator, family counselor and an electrician. The students' and business professionals' interaction is invaluable preparation in their future career search.

Upcoming sessions include interpersonal communication and tech-based communication, which will be facilitated by Maurer and Conlon. #### **Regular Board Meeting**

October 17, 2016

Pat Colgan guided the Board on a tour of the Lake Delhi Damn prior to the board meeting.

Keith Kramer took a few minutes to discuss the Maquoketa Valley chapter of Dollars for Scholars. The chapter recently reached one million dollars in its endowment fund. Families can use the Dollars for Scholars program to not only help a student attend college, but to leave a legacy of a lost loved one by contributing a donation or gift. He also updated the Board on the bonding process for the upcoming renovation project which will begin in the spring. Mr. Tuetken along with the board expressed for their appreciation for all that Mr. Kramer does not only for the Dollars for Scholars program but also for Maquoketa Valley. Mr. Kramer's dedication makes MV who we are!

The Board held the hearing for an early start date for the 2017-2018 school year. Following discussion, the board authorized the submission of a request to begin our 2017-2018 school year as early as allowed by law.

The regular meeting of the Maquoketa Valley Board of Education was called to order by President John Zietlow, at 6:15 p.m., in the Middle School Conference Room in Delhi, Iowa. All motions carried unanimously unless otherwise noted. Five board members were present. There were six staff members present and nine visitors. The agenda and the consent items were approved.

Mrs. Norton shared the district 2015-2016 Progress Report to the Community and took a few minutes to review the information. This report will also be posted on the district website.

Three open enrollment requests out were approved.

The following personnel recommendations were approved:

Barb Hollinrake employed High School Career Planning (9 hours/week) Hannah Crumpton employed Fall Musical

The board approved the closure of the following activity fund accounts: Class of 2013, Class of 2014 and Class of 2015. Fund balances will be transferred to the High School activity fund account. The Board also approved all Dairy Queen donations be deposited into the Student Services activity fund account.

Language changes to board policy 601.030 School Day and new board policies 704.020 Disaster Recovery Plan and 803.040 Public Purpose and Use of Public Funds were reviewed. The Board approved to waive the second reading and adopt these policies on the first official reading.

Representative Lee Hein and Senator Dan Zumbach will attend the November board meeting which will be held in Delhi beginning at 6:00 p.m. on November 21<sup>st</sup>.

The district certified enrollment data on October 15<sup>th</sup>. The district reported a decrease of 3.6 students for the 2016-2017 school year.

Board policy 900 series will be reviewed in November and series 1000 and 100 will be reviewed in December and January.

Erika Imler took a few minutes to discuss the initial comments from the district audit which was completed in October.

The meeting adjourned at 7:00 p.m.

As we begin the second quarter, I am always amazed at how much the first graders have grown. They started out reading short repetitive books with lots of pictures, and now many are beginning to read longer books where they don't need to rely on pictures to decode difficult words. They are able to describe characters in their stories, retell important parts, and make inferences based on what they read. Our first graders have also quickly grasped our guided reading centers, and are able to switch between them seamlessly. In math, they are practicing addition and subtraction strategies to work toward fluency and solving story problems. They think deeply and have meaningful discussions in our science and social studies classes. We have had a great start to our year, and I can't wait to be a part of their





#### 7th /8th grade English/Language Arts

The seventh and eighth grade ELA students began the school year with a study of technical writing. The students used technical writing skills by creating a game to help their classmates study the Iowa Driver's Manual. They also performed a "how to" speech, after creating a technical manual of a skill they wanted to show off. We have some great public speakers in our middle school!

We have recently moved on to a unit including historical fiction. The students chose between books involving Civil Rights issues, the Vietnam War, World War II, and the Berlin Wall. students are reading their novels, noting the setting and the events, and then will compare events in their novel to real-life events in a paper comparing and contrasting the two. They are enjoying studying history while they work on reading skills such as visualization and making connections to what they are reading. We will be working on our discussion skills when we ask open-ended questions in small group discussions. Ask your middle schooler what he or she is reading today!

#### REAL LIFE ACADEMY FOR SENIORS


On Wednesday, November 9, Maquoketa Valley and Ed-Co seniors will have the opportunity to participate in the Real Life Academy at Ed-Co High School. The Real Life Academy is sponsored by the Delaware County School to Work Committee and introduces high school seniors to the real world of day to day finance--making choices, paying bills and dealing with whatever "fate" may hand you.

Participants are assigned one of their chosen professions, their marital status, and whether or not they have children and/or pets. They are also given their monthly salary and a credit card with no outstanding balance. Most students also have a student loan payment. Students are given a checkbook and register and are required to pay taxes, buy or rent housing, purchase vehicles, insurance, fuel, groceries, clothing, make investments and charitable contributions, pay for child care, pay the phone bill, utilities, etc.

Local business people will be at tables that the students visit to pay for their monthly expenses. There will also be a "Fate" table, where students draw two cards of chance. Sometimes these are positive or they might be negative. There is also a roaming nurse and police officer who hand out fate cards. In order to exit the Real Life Academy students must meet with a banker who reviews the check register to make sure that the student is on track and has between \$0 and \$200 left in their account.

This is the ninth year for the Real Life Academy in Delaware County and it is an excellent opportunity for seniors to experience what budgeting is like in the real world. For more information please contact Barb Hollinrake at the high school at 563-922-2091.


