### Take a minute to be thankful for your life.

At work, school, etc., go for a walk around your building or step outside for 15 minutes to breathe the fresh air and muse about how thankful you are for the opportunity to take a break, to stretch your legs, to feel the sun, etc.

Take a moment to notice the little things you're thankful for, like your morning cup of coffee or your pillow when you lay down to go to sleep at night.

### Tell someone you appreciate them.

So often life gets busy that you forget to tell people how much they matter to you, or that you've noticed what they do and it means a lot to you. Expressing your thanks to others will cultivate an atmosphere of thankfulness that can spread out gradually.

### Talk about gratitude with family.

Set aside a time, like the evening meal, to talk about the things you were grateful for that day. Let each family member have a turn to discuss what made them thankful that day.

### Give back as part of giving thanks.

Being thankful isn't just about telling people you are thankful — it's also about giving back to your community and friends. This doesn't mean that you give back so that everything is even and no one "owes" anyone anything. Give because it's the right thing to do and because it feels good to do it.

### Make sure to say "thank you" regularly.

Thank the person who makes your coffee, thank the person who held the door for you, thank the customer service person who helped you figure out why your phone wasn't working. Speaking the words aloud can help cement the feeling of gratitude in your life. When you say thank you to people, make eye contact and smile so they can feel the sincerity.

### Find reasons to be thankful, even when it's difficult.

Sometimes it can be really hard to be thankful in your life. These are the times, however, when it is even more important to cultivate gratitude, because that will help you get through the hard times better than getting angry or upset will. Do not take for granted the many things we have that we did nothing to earn, such as life itself, the beauty of nature, the great country we live in, or the love of our family and friends.

### **Regular Board Meeting**

October 22, 2018

The Board held the hearing for an early start date for the 2019-2020 school year. Following discussion, the Board authorized the submission of a request to begin our 2019-2020 school year as early as allowed by law.

Prior to the start of the regular meeting, the kindergarten team of Melissa Hess, Beth Zietlow and Macey Kintzle discussed how they utilize the newly implemented Heggarty Routine into their classrooms each day.

The regular meeting of the Maquoketa Valley Board of Education was called to order by President John Zietlow at 5:50 p.m. at Earlville Elementary in Earlville, Iowa. All motions carried unanimously unless otherwise noted. Five board members were present. There were eight staff members and three visitors. The agenda and consent items were approved.

The following personnel recommendations were approved:

Samantha Kruse – employed at .5 FTE 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Teacher Kendra Whitman – resignation as Head High School Softball Coach

Language changes to board policy 204.020 Regular School Board Meetings, 502.3 Student Expression, 602.140 Curriculum Development, 604.6 Instruction At A Post-Secondary Educational Institution, 605.030 Student Promotion – Retention- Acceleration, 605.040 Graduation Requirements and 605.042 Online Courses were reviewed. The Board approved to waive the second reading and adopt these policies on the first official reading.

The Board reviewed and approved the drug and alcohol testing contract with Medical Enterprises.

The Board approved the District donation of \$6.00 per hour, not to exceed the number of hours estimated for athletic event ticket taking worked by the Fine Arts Boosters, into the Fine Arts Booster activity fund account.

One open enrollment request out was approved.

The 2019-2020 SBRC Modified Allowable Growth for Dropout Prevention was approved. The Board approved the maximum allowed by state law.

The 2018-2019 SBRC Application for Increasing Enrollment for \$182,601 was approved. This will allow the district to increase spending authority and to levy dollars if needed due to the increased enrollment from October 2017 Certified Enrollment to October 2018 Certified Enrollment.

The district certified enrollment data on October 15<sup>th</sup>. The district reported an increase of 27 students for the 2018-2019 school year.

Board policy 500 series will be reviewed in November and the series 600 and 700 will reviewed in December and January.

Maquoketa Valley Girls Basketball is hosting the Hall of Pride Game on November 16<sup>th</sup>. As the host, we are responsible for the officials and making a donation of \$250 to the Iowa High School Girls Union for the Hall of Pride, therefore no passes will be accepted as admission to this event. Any revenue generated will go back into the girls basketball program. As a part of this game the team will need to participate or organize a positive public service project. The team plans to conduct a food drive for two weeks for the Delaware County Food Pantry.

Supt. Tuetken will bring an updated Early Separation package to the board in November for approval.

Supt. Tuetken took few minutes to discuss the initial comments from the FY18 district audit which was complete in September.

On Monday, October 1<sup>st</sup>, several board members along with Supt. Tuetken and Erika Imler met with the district Mercer representative, Stephanie Getting, to discuss possible insurance options due to escalating costs. The information that was presented at that meeting was shared with the board and possible scenarios were discussed. Further discussion will take place during the next several months.

The meeting adjourned at 6:32 p.m.

### Begin Everyday with a Positive!

Every morning begins with positive thoughts in 3rd grade! This year, we are using the Positive Action curriculum to guide our morning meeting lessons and discussions. These lessons help build our classroom community while also teaching students that you feel good about yourself when you do positive actions. "Positive thoughts cause positive actions which lead to positive feelings" is the motto we follow. Students have learned about creating a positive self concept as well as helping to build up others' self concept through acts of kindness. We talked about individual talents, skills, and personality traits that make each of us unique and special. Students are also learning about positive actions that keep their bodies and minds healthy. We have kept food journals to track that we are eating nutritious foods and calculated our nightly hours of sleep to ensure we are all ready to make the most of each day. Positive Action lessons are a great way to start everyday!

# Wildcat Way- Bus Expectations

The Wildcat Way has been an effective tool to help students learn about being respectful, responsible, and safe in many areas of the school. The Wildcat Way also addresses expectations for all students riding our buses. Being respectful on the buses means students are greeting the bus driver, using appropriate kind and language, and a voice level that allows the driver to focus on the main job of driving. Students also need to respect other's personal space and property. Students demonstrate responsibility by listening to and following directions, keeping track of their personal items, and going directly to their destination after exiting the bus. Students' behavior also effects their safety. Students can be safe by getting on and off the bus carefully, one student at a time. They also need to stay seated (back to back, seat to seat, feet on the floor) and keep their hands and feet to themselves. If students follow these expectations, everyone will have a pleasant bus ride to and from school. One additional procedure in place is we have our youngest students sit in the front of the bus, followed by our early elementary students, and then our upper elementary students. Our middle schoolers and high schoolers sit in the back of the bus. By using this seating arrangement, our students are interacting with students of the same age which is appropriate for them. We all want riding the bus to be a positive experience for everyone involved. If we follow the Wildcat Way, this will be achieved.



### GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

It is the policy of the *Maquoketa Valley* Community School District not to discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, disability, religion, creed, age (for employment), marital status (for programs), sexual orientation, gender identity and socioeconomic status (for programs) in its educational programs and its employment practices. There is a grievance procedure for processing complaints of discrimination. If you have questions or a grievance related to this policy please contact Doug Tuetken at 107 3<sup>rd</sup> Street Delhi, Iowa 52223. You can also contact 563-922-9422 or email to dougtuetken@maquoketa-v.k12.ia.us.

Students, parents of students, employees, and applicants for employment in the school district have the right to file a formal complaint alleging discrimination. The district has policies and procedures in place to identify and investigate complaints alleging discrimination. If appropriate, the district will take steps to prevent the recurrence of discrimination and to correct its discriminatory effects on the Complainant and others.

A Complainant may attempt to resolve the problem informally by discussing the matter with a building principal or a direct supervisor. However, the Complainant has the right to end the informal process at any time and pursue the formal grievance procedures outlined below. Use of the informal or formal grievance procedure is not a prerequisite to the pursuit of other remedies. Please note that informal processes and procedures are not to be used in certain circumstances (e.g., sexual harassment and sexual assault).

### Filing a Complaint

A Complainant who wishes to avail himself/herself of this grievance procedure may do so by filing a complaint with the equity coordinator(s). An alternate will be designated in the event it is claimed that the equity coordinator or superintendent committed the alleged discrimination or some other conflict of interest exists. Complaints shall be filed within 90 of the event, giving rise to the complaint or from the date the Complainant could reasonably become aware of such occurrence. The Complainant will state the nature of the complaint and the remedy requested. The equity coordinator(s) shall assist the Complainant as needed.

### Investigation

Within 15working days, the equity coordinator will begin the investigation of the complaint or appoint a qualified person to undertake the investigation (hereinafter "equity coordinator"). If the Complainant is under 18 years of age, the equity coordinator shall notify his or her parent(s)/guardian(s) that they may attend investigatory meetings in which the Complainant is involved. The complaint and identity of the Complainant, Respondent, or witnesses will only be disclosed as reasonably necessary in connection with the investigation or as required by law or policy. The investigation may include, but is not limited to the following:

- A request for the Complainant to provide a written statement regarding the nature of the complaint;
- A request for the individual named in the complaint to provide a written statement;
- A request for witnesses identified during the course of the investigation to provide a written statement;
- · Interviews of the Complainant, Respondent, or witnesses;
- An opportunity to present witnesses or other relevant information; and
- Review and collection of documentation or information deemed relevant to the investigation.

### NOTICE OF SECTION 504 STUDENT AND PARENTAL RIGHTS

The Maquoketa Valley Community School District does not discriminate in its educational programs and activities on the basis of a student's disability. It has been determined that your child has a qualifying disability for which accommodations may need to be made to meet his or her individual needs as adequately as the needs of other students. As a parent, you have the right to the following:

- Participation of your child in school district programs and activities, including extracurricular programs and activities, to the maximum extent appropriate, free of discrimination based upon the student's disability and at the same level as students without disabilities;
- Receipt of free educational services to the extent they are provided students without disabilities:
- Receipt of information about your child and your child's educational programs and activities in your native language;
- Notice of identification of your child as having a qualifying disability for which accommodations may need to be made and notice prior to evaluation and placement of your child and right to periodically request a re-evaluation of your child;
- Inspect and review your child's educational records including a right to copy those records for a reasonable fee; you also have a right to ask the school district to amend your child's educational records if you feel the information in the records is misleading or inaccurate; should the school district refuse to amend the records, you have a right to a hearing and to place an explanatory letter in your child's file explaining why you feel the records are misleading or inaccurate; and
- Hearing before an impartial hearing officer if you disagree with your child's evaluation or placement; you have a right to counsel at the hearing and have the decision of the impartial hearing officer reviewed.
