### **SCHOOL BOARD MINUTES**

#### Regular Board Meeting September 16, 2019

The regular meeting of the Maquoketa Valley Board of Education was called to order by President John Zietlow at 5:30 p.m. in the High School Conference Room in Delhi, Iowa. All motions carried unanimously unless otherwise noted. Four board members were present. There were seven staff present and four visitors. The agenda and consent items were approved with an adjustment to allow Mrs. Ries and several Spanish students to speak.

Jen Ries, High School Spanish Teacher, and several students spoke about their recent trip to Mexico this past summer. The students shared several of the trip highlights as well as what they learned from their experience.

At 5:48 p.m., President John Zietlow declared this to be the time and place to hold the hearing the Transfer of School Property to the City of Earlville. The transfer would include Lot 1 and Lot 2 of Hazel & Albert Nieman field a subdivision in the Northeast Quarter (NE ¼) of Section Thirty-five (35), Township, Eighty-nine North (T89N), Range Four West (R4W) of the 5<sup>th</sup> P.M., Delaware County, Iowa. There were no comments and the Board President called the hearing closed.

In a motion by Kunde, seconded by Feldmann the Board adopted the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Board deems it necessary and desirable to dispose of the real estate located on 210th and Margaret Streets, Earlville, Delaware County, Iowa ("Property") and legally described as:

Lots One (1) and Two (2) and that portion of the 16.5 foot alley lying Westerly of and adjacent to the West line of said Lots One (1) and Two (2), all in Nieman Subdivision, being a part of the Northeast Quarter (NE ¼) of the Northeast Quarter (NE ¼) of Section Thirty-five (35), Township Eighty-nine North (T89N), Range Four West (R4W) of the 5th P.M., City of Earlville, Delaware County, Iowa, according to corrective plat recorded in Book 2001, Page 3348 in the Office of the Delaware County Recorder

AND

Lot One (1) of Albert & Hazel Nieman Fireworks Field, a subdivision in the Northeast Quarter (NE ¼) of Section Thirty-five (35), Township Eighty-nine North (T89N), Range Four West (R4W) of the 5th P.M., Delaware County, Iowa, per plat recorded in Book 2001, Page 4211 in the Office of the Delaware County Recorder

WHEREAS, the Board has previously set forth its proposal specifying its intent to convey the Property to the City of Earlville, Iowa;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Directors of the Maquoketa Valley Community School District, State of Iowa, as follows:

The Board of Directors of the Maquoketa Valley Community School District, State of Iowa, shall convey to the City of Earlville, Iowa the Property legally described as:

Lots One (1) and Two (2) and that portion of the 16.5 foot alley lying Westerly of and Lots One (1) and Two (2) and that portion of the 16.5 foot alley lying Westerly of and adjacent to the West line of said Lots One (1) and Two (2), all in Nieman Subdivision, being a part of the Northeast Quarter (NE ¼) of the Northeast Quarter (NE ¼) of Section Thirty-five (35), Township Eighty-nine North (T89N), Range Four West (R4W) of the 5th P.M., City of Earlville, Delaware County, Iowa, according to corrective plat recorded in Book 2001, Page 3348 in the Office of the Delaware County Recorder

AND

Lot One (1) of Albert & Hazel Nieman Fireworks Field, a subdivision in the Northeast Quarter (NE ¼) of Section Thirty-five (35), Township Eighty-nine North (T89N), Range Four West (R4W) of the 5th P.M., Delaware County, Iowa, per plat recorded in Book 2001, Page 4211 in the Office of the Delaware County Recorder

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the President of the Board of Directors is authorized to execute a warranty deed and the necessary documentation to complete this transaction.

A roll call vote was answered as follows: Feldmann, Huber, Kunde, Zietlow; all ayes. Carried. It was noted that the property shall be named after the Nieman family and used for children. If at any time, this is not the case, the property will be deeded back to the District.

### SCHOOL BOARD MINUTES

The 2018-2019 Maquoketa Valley Annual Progress Report was approved. It was noted that Maquoketa Valley reported a 100% graduation rate for the 2018-2019 school year.

Language changes to board policy 201.040 Board of Directors and 201.060 Term of Office were reviewed and approved.

Troy Osterhaus, Brenda Becker and Doug Tuetken will serve as the District Level I Investigators for the 2019-2020 school year.

One open enrollment in and one open enrollment out were approved.

The 2019-2020 fund raising activities were approved.

The following personnel recommendations were approved:

Sara Dever – employed as TLC Mentor Tiersa Frasher – employed as TLC Mentor Jessica Wessels – employed as TLC Mentor Randy Turner – employed as Head High School Baseball Coach

The Board approved the lease agreement with Community Development Institute Head Start for the 2019-2020 school year.

The Board approved filing the application to the SBRC for Modified Allowable Growth for negative 2018-2019 Special Education balance in the amount of \$366,148.48.

The Board adopted the following resolution to consider the District's continued participation in the Instructional Support Program:

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors has determined that to continue the current level of services and to fund the ongoing programs of the School District, continuation of participation in the Instructional Support Program for a period of five years is necessary and in the best interests of the District and its residents and students; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors wishes to consider continued participation in the Instructional Support Program as provided in Sections 257.18 through 257.21, Code of Iowa; and

WHEREAS, the authorization for the current Instructional Support Program will expire on June 30, 2021; and

WHEREAS, this Resolution sets forth the proposal of the Board of Directors, including the method that will be used to fund the program; and

WHEREAS, notice of the time and place of a public hearing must be published: NOW, THEREFORE, it is resolved:

The Board of Directors wishes to consider continued participation in the Instructional Support Program as provided in Sections 257.18 through 257.21, Code of Iowa, for a period of five years, commencing with the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022.

The additional funding for the Instructional Support Program for a budget year shall be determined annually and shall not exceed ten percent (10%) of the total regular program district cost for the budget year and moneys received under Section 257.14, Code of Iowa, as a budget adjustment for the budget year.

Moneys received by the District for the Instructional Support Program may be used for any general fund purpose.

The Instructional Support Program will be funded by instructional support state aid and an instructional support property tax levied annually upon the taxable property within the School District.

The Secretary is authorized and directed to give notice of a public hearing to be held in the High School Conference Room, 107 South Street, Delhi, Iowa, on October 21, 2019, 5:30 P.M.

Following the public hearing the Board intends to take action on the question whether to continue participation in the Instructional Support Program.

### **SCHOOL BOARD MINUTES**

A hearing was set for October 21, 2019 at the Maquoketa Valley High School Conference Room in Delhi, Iowa for the purpose of approving the start date for the 2020-2021 school year.

John Zietlow was elected as the 2019-2020 Maquoketa Valley designee on the County Conference Board with any of the remaining board members serving as an alternate.

A legislative work session will be held in conjunction with the December board meeting and the North Linn School Board. This meeting will be held on Monday, December 16<sup>th</sup> at a location in Ryan. Final arrangements will be made and the location will be posted.

Supt. Tuetken shared some information regarding joining the Rural School Advocates of Iowa. Further discussion on joining this organization will take place at future meetings.

Maquoketa Valley Community School District was recognized by the IASB Safety Group Insurance Program as a IASB Safety Group leader in the area of Workers Compensation.

Supt. Tuetken shared information regarding the upcoming AEA elections which will be held in November.

Supt. Tuetken updated the Board on the status of the Silver Lake project. Supt. Tuetken shared the expectations for the District in regards to watershed improvements.

Supt. Tuetken will meet with the Fire Chiefs from Delhi, Delaware, Earlville and Hopkinton to review the District's evacuation plan. This meeting will take place on September 25<sup>th</sup> at 6:30. Supt. Tuetken also noted that he has begun the process of trying to secure volunteers for the District's Reunification Team.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:55 p.m.



### ELEMENTARY NEWS

#### Kindergarten

Our littlest wildcats of Maquoketa Valley have had a great start to the year. Kindergarten is such a magical time, and the beginning of the year is no different. We have spent a lot of time these first few weeks learning what it means to be a wildcat by learning the Wildcat Way Expectations. The kids have worked really hard on using their 1 or 2 voice in the classroom, walking in the hallway, keeping their hands and feet to themselves, drinking at the "top of the rainbow" when the water comes out of the water fountain and using their kind words throughout the building. There are a lot of expectations to learn at the beginning of the year and the kindergarten kids have done a great job with this.

We have also started our Positive Action curriculum and have been introduced to the puppets Pix-It and Nix-It. Pix-It and Nix-It have taught us that our self concept is how we feel about ourselves. We have learned about positive thinking vs. negative thinking and how these thoughts can change our day. We are so excited to travel with Pix-It and Nix-It through the Kingdom of Positive Action and learn more about our feelings and how to handle them.



First Grade

The first graders are off to a great start this year! They have learned so many new rules and procedures that come with being in a new building. Many of them are loving the new gaga ball pit at recess. They are showing off their reading skills, writing stories, and practicing phonics sounds. In math, they are learning to count on and make ten. Through experimentation in science class, they have discovered that sound is caused by vibration and how to change the volume and pitch of a sound. We are so excited to continue learning and exploring together this school year!



### The Regulation Station Delhi Elementary 3-5

Students have been learning about the Zones of Regulation, which is a curriculum that teaches students how to regulate their emotions. Through guidance and classroom lessons, students have learned many tools and strategies to help them self-regulate in the classroom. Some situations and some students require more time, space, or assistance from an adult. This is where The Regulation Station comes into play.

The Regulation Station is a safe place where students can go if they are in need of a quiet place to refocus, recenter, regulate or just need a break. Students typically go to The Regulation Station on their own, but there may be times when a teacher may ask a student if they need to utilize the room. The regulation station is located in a small room off our library and is supervised by an adult. Our goal is to provide a safe, private space with a variety of calming tools to assist students in getting regulated so they can return to class and be their best self!

As adults, we self regulate all the time and have probably never called it self regulation. Sometimes when we are stressed, we may need to take a break. During this time we may take deep breaths, we may need to remove ourselves from a situation, we may go the long way home so we can clear our minds, or we may listen to music to help us to feel more calm. These are all examples of self regulation techniques that we as adults do everyday.

As a school, our goal is to educate and assist our students on a variety of self regulation strategies that they can use whenever and wherever they need. Please let us know if you have any questions.
