#### Weight Room Update

The Wildcat weight room is always busy. On a daily basis there are anywhere from 30+ to 60+ student-athletes that utilize the weight room. Student-athletes from 7th grade through 12th grade are a majority of the athletes that use the weight room but we have a few younger 6th grade siblings that come in as well.

All of our weight room sessions are supervised by myself as the weight room coordinator and/or by a licensed coach. We have various programs for kids who are in-season, off-season and also age appropriate. We have almost as many girls lifting consistently as we do boys.

Recently, we made a joint purchase with the Booster Club to get (3) more Racks, dumbbells, plates and boxes to be able to make our area more efficient. The space is not large so efficiency is key when trying to get 40+ kids through a workout in less than an hour. The new equipment has already helped make the room work better for everyone involved.

We group our athletes by sport in terms of their workout days and also the workouts that they are doing. A few weeks ago we finished up our fall training schedule and now we have started our winter training schedule with Boys Basketball, Girls Basketball and Wrestling, which includes both our JH and HS programs.

Athletes utilize their phone to track individual weight, reps, sets and it also contains a timer for various exercises. As the weight room coordinator, I adjust, update and modify the program to best fit the equipment we have, the space and the amount of athletes working out in that group along with managing the calendar for our athletes who may participate in 1, 2, 3 or 4 sports. Management of the athletes who are in 4 sports is a challenge because they are always practicing and playing except for a few weeks a year. Below is a picture of what the app looks like for our athletes. The old school method of tracking all of it on paper has been replaced by a computer that can give a lot of useful information and allow for adjustments throughout by both the athlete and the coach. This is my 5th year using Volt and it continues to keep getting better each year.

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

#### **Regular Board Meeting**

November 15, 2021

The regular meeting of the Maquoketa Valley Board of Education was called to order by President Donna Kunde at 5:30 p.m. in the High School Library in Delhi, Iowa. All motions carried unanimously unless otherwise noted. Five board members were present. There were five staff members and nine visitors present. The agenda and consent items were approved.

Erika Imler reported the official results of the Board election that was held on November 2<sup>nd</sup>. Election results reported were as follows: in Director District #2, Doug Dabroski received 481 votes and was duly elected for the office of Maquoketa Valley School Board Director District #2 for a term of four years; in Director District #3, Manuel Ricardo Bojorquez received 451 votes and was duly elected for the office of Maquoketa Valley School Board Director District #3 for a term of four years; in Director District #4, Mike Feldmann received 456 votes and was duly elected for the office of Maquoketa Valley School Board Director District #4 for a term of four years. In a motion by Zietlow, seconded by Feldmann the canvas of results was approved. All ayes. Carried.

FY21 books were examined and settled.

Supt. Hoeger, along with the entire Board, expressed appreciation to Chris Huber for her service and dedication to the Maquoketa Valley Community School District for the past 12 years. They wished her good luck on her future endeavors.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:44 p.m.

#### Organizational Board Meeting November 15, 2021

The organizational meeting of the Maquoketa Valley Board of Education was called to order by Superintendent Hoeger at 5:45 p.m. in the High School Conference Room in Delhi, Iowa. All motions carried unanimously unless otherwise noted. There were five board members were present. Five staff members and nine visitors were also present.

Erika Imler administered the Oath of Office to the newly elected Board Members.

The first order of business was to elect the officers for the 2021-2022 school year. Supt. Hoeger called for nominations for President of the Board of Directors. Donna Kunde was elected as President and John Zietlow was elected as Vice-President.

#### **Organizational Board Meeting**

November 15, 2021

The Board set the monthly meeting date and time for the 2021-2022 year as the third Monday of each month. Meetings will begin at 5:30 p.m.

Several students from the FFA program presented the Board with information regarding their recent trip on Indianapolis for the National FFA Convention. The dairy team consisting of Alia Domeyer, Lane Domeyer, Haley Ronnebaum and Courtney Goedken placed third in their dairy judging event and invited to the Royal Highland Show in Scotland.

Three open enrollment requests out and two open enrollment requests in were approved.

The following personnel recommendation was approved:

Macey Anderegg – resignation as Assistant High School Softball Coach

The Board approved the appointment of Supt. Dave Hoeger to the Greater Delaware County Community Foundation.

Agenda item number 12 was amended to include additional fundraising activities. The Board then approved the Miss Lau's out-of-country travel request and additional fundraising activities for the FFA students. The students will be conducting additional fundraising activities to help fund their trip to Scotland for the Royal Highland Show.

The 2021-2022 SBRC Application for Increasing Enrollment, Open Enrollment Out and LEP Instruction Beyond Five Years for \$120,701.80 was approved. This will allow the district to increase spending authority and to levy dollars if needed.

The 2021-2022 Voluntary Early Separation of Certified Staff was approved. The Board approved a separation package of \$57,000 for Certified Staff. These funds will be paid out in three equal installments into a Health Reimbursement Arrangement account. The first installment will begin in August of 2022.

The Enrollment Express Contract was approved.

In informational and discussion items, it was noted that the hourly sub rate for non-certified staff was increased from  $$11.00 \text{ to } $13.00 \text{ effective October } 1^{\text{st}}$ .

Plan for the upcoming IASB Convention were discussed.

A legislative forum has been set on November 29<sup>th</sup> beginning at 6:00 p, m. in Edgewood.

Post Prom will be teaming with Heims Awards to do an additional fundraiser. They will be selling tumblers, cutting boards and other engraved items.

Supt. Hoeger updated the Board on the pending employee vaccination requirements that are set to in enforced as of December 6<sup>th</sup>.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:40 p.m.
