Dying Words

Araminta Ross (Harriet Tubman) is estimated to have been born between 1820 and 1822 in Dorchester County, Maryland, and she had 8 siblings. Most of her formative years were spent



doing domestic slavery at plantations neighboring where her parents labored. Harriet showed signs of her anti-slavery ideals as young as twelve when she tried to prevent the beating of another slave who tried to escape. Because she intervened, she was hit over the head with a two-pound weight, and this head trauma led to a life with narcolepsy and severe headaches.

In 1844, Harriet entered a "marriage" with a freedman named John Tubman. Legally, they weren't allowed to marry, but Araminta took his surname and changed her first name to Harriet.

While Harriet may not have been the one to create the Underground Railroad (as that was done by white and black abolitionists before her), she still played a major role in its success. After escaping slavery herself (without her husband, who legally married a free black woman), Harriet returned several times to help other slaves escape. She was so successful that many slave owners had rewards of up to \$40,000 just to have her captured or killed. Harriet never lost a slave when she was helping them escape. Because of her familiarity with the South, Harriet was a spy for the Union army during the Civil War. She'd often go undercover in the South to gain more information from slaves that she eventually helped escape. She was also a nurse for the Union army. Her activism didn't end after the war. She joined the efforts of Elizabeth Cady Stanton and Susan B. Anthony in the fight for women's suffrage.

To provide for herself, she worked on an autobiography with Sarah Bradford. She married a Union soldier who was also born into slavery named Nelson Davis. They lived together in New York where she cared for the elderly. Eventually, the couple adopted a daughter. For her service, Harriet was awarded \$20— which she had to fight for. After her husband died, Harriet received \$8 per month as a pension. Harriet was able to start the Harriet Tubman Home for the Aged near her home. She passed away in 1913, and her burial was hosted with military honors.

When she died, she had requested to sing, so her final words were:

"Swing low sweet chariot."
