

Maquoketa Valley School Community,

I hope the students and staff are enjoying some time away from school and everyone is enjoying some summertime fun. We have many projects we are working on at Maguoketa Valley. The major project is the replacement of the football bleachers. We are anticipating the project to be completed in late August. There was a storage facility under our old bleachers and we are planning on our students building a new storage garage in the fall under the direction of our Industrial Technology teacher, Mr. Palmer.

Below are some computer renderings of the new bleachers. The first photo shows the entry to the new bleachers looking from west to east. You will see that the patio will extend from our current patio directly onto the bleachers. This will make the bleachers very handicap accessible. There is a set of steps to get from the patio to the sidewalk in the bottom of the photo. This is where our patio ends currently. Both the home and visitor bleachers are set back from the track in case there is an interest in the future to expand the track from six to eight

The next photo gives you an idea of what the press box will look like. There are five rooms in the press box. There is also a platform on each side of the pressbox for people to stand outside and videotape. The capacity of the home section of bleachers is 952 plus 8 handicap seats. The handicap seats are not shown in this rendering but there will be several sections cut from the first row of seats allowing wheelchairs to back up to the second row.



# Regular Board Meeting - May 15, 2023 -

5:30 p.m. High School Library, Delhi, Iowa

The regular meeting of the Maquoketa Valley Board of Education was called to order by President Donna Kunde at 5:30 p.m. on May 15, 2023 in the High School Library in Delhi. All motions carried unanimously unless otherwise noted.

At 5:31 p.m., President Donna Kunde declared this to be the time and place to hold the hearing on the proposed budget amendment for the 2022-2023 school year. Due to the stadium project starting in FY23, the Other Expenditures line of the certified budget may exceed what was certified for FY23. The District will be increasing the Other Expenditures line by \$500,000. The documents were reviewed and there being no comments, the Board President declared the hearing closed. In order to proceed with the scheduled PPEL projects and cash flow these projects in the next three years, the District will borrow against PPEL funds in the amount of \$1,535,000. The District will work with Piper Sandler as the placement agent and Ahlers & Cooney as the bond counsel. In a motion by Zietlow, seconded by Overman the Engagement Letters for both Piper and Ahlers as well as the Distribution of Term Sheet for the \$1,535,000 General Obligation Capital Loan notes was approved. All ayes. Carried.

In a motion by Dabroski, seconded by Overman the following resolution was approved:

RESOLUTION DECLARING AN OFFICIAL INTENT UNDER TREASURY REGULATION 1.150-2 TO ISSUE

DEBT TO REIMBURSE THE SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR CERTAIN ORIGINAL EXPENDITURES PAID IN CONNECTION WITH SPECIFIED PROJECTS.

WHEREAS, the School District anticipates making cash expenditures for one or more capital Improvement projects generally described below (each of which shall hereinafter be referred to as a "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the School District reasonably expects to issue debt to reimburse the costs of a Project; and

WHEREAS, the Board believes it is consistent with the School District's budgetary and financial. Circumstances to issue this declaration of official intent.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE MAQUOKETA VALLEY

COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRIT, STATE OF IOWA.

A roll call vote was answered as follows: Dabroski, Feldmann, Kunde, Overman, Zietlow; all ayes. Carried.

In a motion by Feldmann, seconded by Zietlow the Board approved stadium project change order #1 in the amount of (\$3,900). This deduct was a result of the crow's nest windows being modified from aluminum to vinyl due to product availability. All ayes. Carried.

The Board approved the Earlville playground equipment and surfacing bid from Boland Recreation in the amount of \$152,205. The estimated delivery on this equipment if roughly 32 weeks out so this will be a 2024 summer project. All ayes. Carried.

The Board approved the purchase and payment of a 12-passenger van from J's Auto not to exceed \$44,000. All ayes. Carried.

A special meeting for will take place at 8:00 A.M. on June 1<sup>st</sup> in order to proceed with the \$1,535,000 General Obligation Capital Loan notes process.

Supt. Hoeger commented that the High School Football and Girls Basketball teams will help at the Delaware County Fair this summer with teardown and set-up as a fundraiser for their programs.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:59 p.m. in a motion by Feldmann, seconded by Overman. All ayes. Carried.

# Maquoketa Valley Wraps Up FOUR Scholastic Book Fairs: Books, Books, and More BOOKS!



The Scholastic Book Fair visited Maguoketa Valley from March 15 through March 23 in Delhi, Earlville, and Hopkinton. Students spent these days creating Wish Lists, previewing the Book Fair, and participating in a Pre-8 Coin War. The hallways were buzzing with an eagerness to earn some new books for our district classrooms and libraries. The Coin War took place the week of March 14-17 with the winners earning special prizes as they brought in pennies, nickels, dimes, and guarters. The competition got fierce as each Pre-5 classroom was eager to win privileges such as lunch in the classroom, extra recess, chewing gum in the classroom, read and feed days, and other incentives. The elementary students (Pre-5) were able to raise \$3,699.95 to purchase new books for their classrooms (Earlville: \$323.81; Johnston: \$1,172.77; Delhi: \$2,203.37). This is a \$200+ increase from last year which equals about 25 more books for classrooms! The Middle School students (grades 6-8) got excited about a separate bank of prizes: Hat Day, Choose the School's Lunch, BINGO! during WIN, and others - with the largest incentive being a Movie in the Auditorium. For every \$25 earned per English class, the students would cash in on another incentive. The Middle School students were able to raise \$1,010.19 to purchase new books for their English classrooms. This smashed last year's total of \$846.86 and was by far the most earned in the eight years that the Middle School has participated in the Coin War! With the money earned over the course of the Coin War, teachers were able to purchase hundreds of new books for their classrooms (Pre-8). The students were thrilled! Check out the pictures of some of the new classroom books on our MV Facebook page. Again this year, students were able to make purchases from the Book Fair during school hours. Using their Wish List to guide them, students came to the Book Fair during the school day and found books that made their hearts and minds happy to read. They were able to walk away from the Book Fair with their new book(s) in hand to take home! All of this excitement spilled over into the following week when the Book Fair opened to the public for two nights during Spring Conferences (March 21 and March 23). With the profit earned from this year's Book Fair, our district libraries will be able to purchase new books using Scholastic Dollars this school year with many more to be purchased during the upcoming 2023-2024 school year. A big "THANK YOU" to the families who donated to the Coin War, to all those who purchased from the Book Fair, and to everyone who contributed to the success of MV's Scholastic Book Fair this year -- our classrooms, libraries, teachers, and students benefit greatly from your support!

## **Work Experience Shout Out!**

The purpose of the Work Experience course is for the students to establish an employee-employer relationship in some local business or industry. Students have been placed within the school or in a community work site to explore various job skills. This career exploration opportunity can be a paid or unpaid experience. Students can work 1-2 class periods per day at the worksite and earn one or two credit hours per semester.

Several of our seniors participated in a Work Experience course this past school year at various job sites in the local area. The sites included Stanley Infrastructure, Delhi Thrift Store, Delhi Public Library, Shover Farms, and Norby's. In the past, students have also participated in a work experience course at Delhi Landing.

The partnership with local businesses provides a multitude of opportunities for our students to continue to learn and grow in their employability skills. Thank you to all of the local businesses for their continued support of Maquoketa Valley Schools.

# NHS converted to service organization

Due to affiliation costs and duplication of recognition, MV will discontinue its membership to National Honor Society and will instead begin a service program for students. Students will be made aware of service opportunities, given opportunities to lead service projects, held responsible for tracking their service hours and accomplishments, and recognized publicly at graduation (indication in the program and by a cord/medal).

The goal is to recognize students who have contributed to their community or school by volunteering their time and talents. An increasing number of scholarship applications require applicants to list service experiences. Additionally, volunteer time often leads to employment and future educational opportunities as well as helps students to understand the connection between school, work, and community.

What counts as "service"? Service for this purpose is defined through the voluntary contributions made by a student to the school or community, done without personal compensation or classroom credit. Examples include coaching youth teams, helping at church or community events, managing/keeping stats/video recording an athletic team, setting up for speech or FFA contest or assisting at contest, working on set for drama, volunteering at the public library or fire department, mentoring, serving as a teacher assistant, etc.

This program will begin this summer, and students will be phased into it:

- Class of 2024: 225 hours from June 2021-May 1, 2024
- Class of 2025 and beyond: 300 hours
