We also completed asphalt project on the visitor parking lot across the street from the school. This looks great and will provide a safe and organized space for students and fans to park.

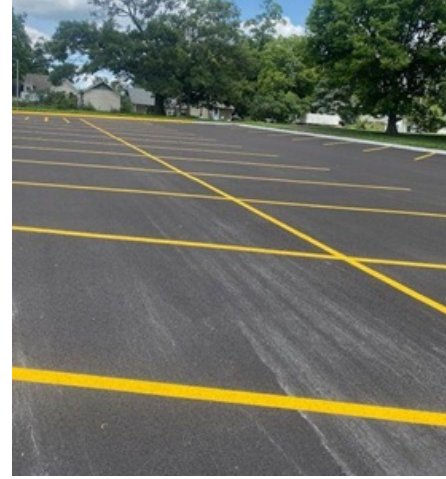
We are also working on the installation of a new boiler in Earlville and the replacement of some sidewalks in need of repair.

2023-2024 MV School Registration Information

Registration for the upcoming school year will be required to be completed online on PowerSchool. This process will be available beginning Wednesday, August 2nd. Student registration fees and lunch fees can be paid online through RevTrak. If you are unable to complete either process online, please call Sarah or Brandy at the high school **(563-922-2091)** to set up a time to come in. This will be by appointment only.

If you are returning to the district or adding a new student to your account:

1. Please log onto your PowerSchool portal by using the following steps:
2. Go to www.maquoketa-v.k12.ia.us
3. Click on POWERSCHOOL link on right hand side.
4. Enter your username and password.
5. Go to the bottom left hand side and select FORMS. *(if you are adding a student, click on ACCOUNT PREFERENCES and STUDENTS then ADD. Use information at the top of this sheet)*
6. Complete all of the forms listed then submit when finished. *(this process should be done for each child in the district - names listed on top of page)*
7. On the left hand side, click on SORT CONTACTS. Make sure each person listed has a relationship selected for their name.
8. If you're wanting to add a contact, on the left hand side, click on UPDATE CONTACTS. *****Now that you have registered your child(ren), you need to pay for registration and lunch fees*****
9. Click on REVTRAK link on left hand side.
10. Enter your username and password for REVTRAK. (which is separate from PowerSchool)
11. Click on POWERSCHOOL FEES for registration fees and FOOD SERVICE for lunch fees.
12. You will be directed to enter in your debit or credit card information at checkout.
13. Click on COMPLETE ORDER and you may view and print your receipt if desired.

*****Fees for registration or lunch can always be dropped off at the school or sent with your child*****

*****If you forgot your RevTrak password, please click on forgot password to reset*****

If you are new to the district, you will need to create a PowerSchool account by following

these steps:

1. Go to www.maquoketa-v.k12.ia.us
2. Select POWERSCHOOL link on right hand side.
3. Select CREATE ACCOUNT and again CREATE ACCOUNT.
4. Fill in your parent information, create your own username and password (*which must be 6 characters long*) and fill in your child's name, access ID, access password and relationship. (*access ID and access password are on the top of this sheet*)
5. You will then be directed to the PowerSchool login page to enter the username and password you created.
6. Once you login, go to the bottom left hand side and click on FORMS.
7. Complete all of the forms then click on save, then submit when finished.
8. On the left hand side, click on UPDATE CONTACTS. Make sure each person listed has a relationship selected for their name.
9. On the left hand side, click on SORT CONTACTS. Make sure they are in your preferred order. Then save. *****Now that you have registered your child(ren), you need to pay for registration and lunch fees*****

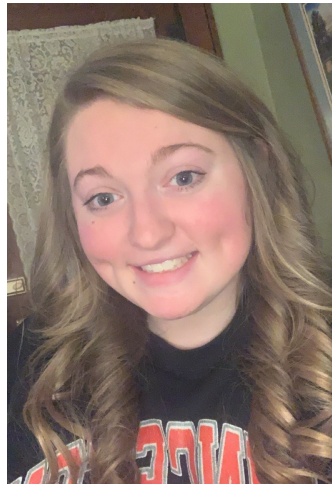

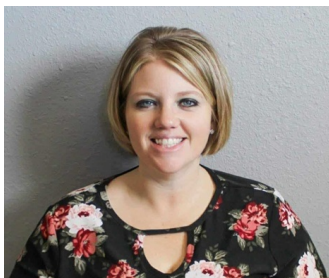

Food Service Need to Know

Check your current lunch account balance: Log into your online account or call/email Morgan to get your current lunch account balance. You can make deposits at any time, and it is best to start the school year with a positive balance.

Free/Reduced Applications: The due date was July 27th. These forms must be filled out as soon as possible so we have enough time to process your application and correct your registration fees. [Free/Reduced applications](#) can be found online, or there are copies in the Delhi Middle School/Elementary Office.

Salad Bar: This year, there will be a salad bar offered to all adult employees and all high school students Monday-Friday. The salad bar will be an alternate meal choice. You will not be able to get the salad bar in addition to the main meal being offered. The salad bar will be located in the High School cafeteria area.

Cheese Sticks: Students in preschool-fourth grade have the option of taking a cheese stick for a snack each day. Regardless if you qualify for Free/Reduced benefits, you will still be charged the full \$0.35 per cheese stick. Cheese Sticks are charged to your account every Friday for the entire

week.

Student breakfast: \$1.85

Earlville & Johnston & Delhi Elementary Student Lunch: \$2.55

Middle School & High School Student Lunch \$2.80

Cheese Stick: \$0.35

Extra Entree: \$2.00

Extra Milk: \$0.65

Extra Juice: \$0.70

Charging on negative Accounts: Be sure to watch your lunch account balance. If your family lunch account reaches an amount of Negative \$50.00 or more, students will be given an alternate meal until the account balance is improved. An alternate meal due to low account balance will consist of a deli sandwich and no additional seconds or ala carte items.

Alternate main course meal option: This year, we will have an alternate main course substitute at each meal. This substitute will consist of, a deli sandwich. Students may choose this instead of the main course any given day.

How and where to deposit lunch money: You can always send lunch money with your students to turn in to the secretary at their building, or you can go online and make deposits into your account.

NHS Converted to Service Organization

Due to affiliation costs and duplication of recognition, MV will discontinue its membership to the National Honor Society and will instead begin a service program for students. Students will be made aware of service opportunities, given opportunities to lead service projects, held responsible for tracking their service hours and accomplishments, and recognized publicly at graduation (indication in the program and by a cord/medal).

The goal is to recognize students who have contributed to their community or school by volunteering their time and talents. An increasing number of scholarship applications require applicants to list service experiences. Additionally, volunteer time often leads to employment and future educational opportunities and helps students understand the connection



between school, work, and community.

What counts as “service”? Service for this purpose is defined through the voluntary contributions made by a student to the school or community, done without personal compensation or classroom credit. Examples include coaching youth teams, helping at church or community events, managing/keeping stats/video recording an athletic team, setting up for speech or FFA contest or assisting at contest, working on set for drama, volunteering at the public library or fire department, mentoring, serving as a teacher assistant, etc.

This program will begin this summer, and students will be phased into it:

- Class of 2024: 225 hours from June 2021-May 1, 2024
- Class of 2025 and beyond: 300 hours

A Note from Nurse Mary & Nurse Jill

Students entering the grades listed below need to have the following:

Preschool: A physical and current immunizations.

JK/K: A physical, current immunizations, dental screening, and vision screening (the “KidSight” program (that comes to school) will qualify).

All students entering, advancing or transferring into 7th grade and born after September 15, 2004, will need proof of one dose of meningitis vaccine. In addition to the meningitis vaccine for those entering into 7th grade, they will also be required to provide proof of Tdap vaccine. Proof of these vaccines will need to be provided PRIOR to the start of the first day of school or at school registration.

All students entering, advancing, or transferring into 12th grade and born after September 15, 1999, will need proof of two doses of the meningitis vaccine; or 1 dose if received when the student was 16 years of age or older. Proof of this vaccine will need to be provided PRIOR to the start of the first day of school or at school registration.

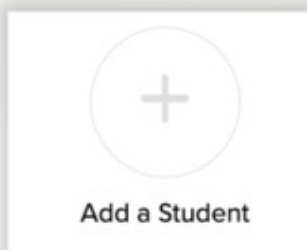
