New driving simulator test students' skills



The team returns all-conference athletes and seniors Toby Grimm, Kody Hoeger and Lance McShane. Other returning letter winners include junior Tate Intorf and sophomores Ty Hoeger, Anderson Holtz, Dylan Knipper, Preston Salow and Brady Wall.

Coach Conner noted that the team has experience going in its favor: "We have three seniors coming back to this year's team who all had great seasons for us last year. All three of our seniors had All-Con-



ference seasons last year, so we are really looking forward to seeing how much more they have grown as players in the off-season. Our juniors and seniors are looking to make a big impact for us this year and add some depth. Top to bottom, this is the deepest team that we have had at MV in quite a while, and we are really looking forward to this season."

In terms of the conference race, Coach Conner acknowledged that the Wildcats will face some tough competition both within the division and in the cross-division games. "I believe our guys are up to the challenge and will use the tough strength of schedule that we have to hopefully make another deep postseason run," he noted.

Girls basketball

Despite the returning talent, Coach Moenck knows the team has some work to do: "My main concern going into this season is how do we make up for the things we lost to graduation.
