Every day, your motivation to keep going got smaller almost as if it was shrinking. The things that used to be enjoyable were just things you HAD to go to now. Waking up didn't seem worth it anymore, and every day you silently wished you wouldn't wake up the next morning. It's not like you wanted to die...you just didn't want to be alive. Being alive meant going through the painful emotions... you just wanted eternal peace. Maybe dying wouldn't be so bad... You sit at your desk, pen in hand and start writing down on the paper. Dear Mom, Dad, Friends, Teachers...today is my final day. I love you all.

According to the World Health Organization, 720,000 people die to suicide each year, and for every suicide there are even more people who have attempted at it. Suicide is also the third leading cause of death within teenagers. So, for Suicide Awareness Month, I want to make a difference and advocate for everyone who even considers ending their life. You are not alone, and there are people who can help you.

Why do I have the right to be talking about this? How do you know I am not just like every other person who advocates for this stuff, but hasn't personally experienced it themselves? I have struggled with my mental health since I was young and was diagnosed with Major Depres-

sive Disorder in 2020. Mental health has always been a struggle, and I have been lucky to be surrounded by some great people in recent years that have



been able to help me. But that doesn't mean it has always been sunshine and rainbows. I have had a suicide attempt, and I know what it's like to be at your lowest point. I am now seeking help through therapy and a psychologist, and you can too.

The first step to recovery is asking for help. It can be scary at first, but there are people who want to help you. Nobody is going to be mad at you for having those feelings, and if they are, there are always people who won't. If there is a teacher who is close to you, your parents or family member, or the guidance counselor, that you feel safe enough to talk to, then do it. These trusted adults will be able to help you get the things you need, whether it be a therapist who you can talk to about everything, or a psychiatrist who can diagnose you and stabilize your life with meds.

Suicide is never an option. It may seem like the easy way out of suffering, but it is never the correct option. There will be lots of people who will miss you when you are gone, including everyone at this school who will wonder where it all went wrong. You are the only you in this world, so embrace it while you can, and try to seek the good in the world. I love you all, and I will see you all next week!
